THE LITURGICAL WEEK

Nov 5 –The prophet denounces those priests who in their pride have turned away from the Law, causing others to go astray. Jesus, too, is critical of those religious leaders who fail to practice what they preach. All, rather, are called to greatness through humility and service, by sharing their lives with others.

Nov 6– Sinful humanity is mysteriously redeemed by God's mercy and love. No one is excluded from the table of the Lord.

Nov 7–Serve one another in love, in humility, and simplicity of heart. All are invited to share in the Lord's banquet, especially the poor.

Nov 8–Discipleship entails both prudence and the renouncement of attachments. But above all, it entails love.

Nov 9—The waters flowing from the temple, the dwelling place of the Lord, bring forth life and growth. Jesus is the living sanctuary, and we his living body in the Spirit.

Nov 10–The Lord has revealed to the nations the gospel of Jesus Christ. As his disciples, we are to be in the world but not of it.

Nov 11- May the God who strengthens us in the gospel be praised forever! Jesus reminds his disciples to seek only those things which will bring lasting joy.
