In recent weeks, an allegation of misconduct from the late 1980s was received by the Victim Outreach and Prevention Office of the Archdiocese of Omaha. This allegation was against Tom Sellentin, a priest who was removed from active ministry in 2002.

The Archdiocese of Omaha is committed to provide outreach for all those who have been wounded by clergy sexual misconduct. Because of the commitment, notification is being published in parish bulletins where this former priest was assigned.
