THE LITURGICAL WEEK

Apr 27— Jesus commissions his disciples to go forth and joyfully preach what they have seen and heard.

Apr 28—As Thomas believed because he saw the risen Jesus, so too were many brought to faith through the various signs and wonders wrought by the apostles. They proclaimed as Lord “the stone rejected by the builders”, “The First and the Last of the One who lives”.

Apr 29— Begotten of the Spirit, the disciples speak with confidence of Jesus in whom they have taken refuge.

Apr 30— The community of believers bears witness to the risen Lord, the king of glory, who was lifted up that we might have eternal life.

May 1—The apostles, delivered from jail, persist in preaching in the name of Jesus, God’s only Son.

May 2—The apostles confront the Sanhedrin and proclaim the testimony of the One from heaven.

May 3—Jesus speaks to Philip of his communion with the Father. James experiences the risen Lord. Their preaching resounds throughout the world.
