Friends,

Every team I've ever been associated with always began the year by meeting and discussing goals for the upcoming season. Of course, this makes perfect sense. In order to plan for a journey of any kind, you always must know where you would like to go before you begin the work of getting there.

The same thing is true of the most important journey any of us ever make; our journey to heaven. Like any sport season, it is important that we reflect from time to time on the goals of our life...to get to heaven. But, before we can enter heaven, there is a process that every fallen human being must go through. That process is called death.

Death is defined as the moment the body separates from the soul. Notice what this means. Science can't tell us precisely when someone dies. Since the soul is immaterial, the only thing medical professional can do is look for signs that this separation has taken place (e.g. heart rate, respiratory activity, brain activity, etc...). It is only when enough signs are present that, in the opinion of the medical professional, the separation of the soul and body has taken place.

This has significant ramifications for our society. After all, some things are morally permitted after death that certainly wouldn't be morally permitted before. For example, suppose someone has agreed to be an organ donor, which is a noble and charitable act. Many times, however, the key to successful donations is to use organs donated as recently as possible. This puts tremendous pressure on medical professionals, who often find themselves in situations where one person's death could greatly enhance another's life.

Certainly, harvesting organs before a person is declared dead is immoral, while harvesting them afterwards would be laudable. However, since determining that moment is somewhat arbitrary and since there can be intense pressure to harvest organs as close to death as possible, it could be quite tempting to manipulate situations to suit the best interest of the one making decisions. This is part of the reason why end-of-life decisions, including when organs should be harvested, are so incredibly complex. It is impossible to know for sure exactly when life ends and death occurs.

Additionally, what happens to the body after death does matter. You see, our bodies are not merely some machine that our soul operates until, one day, the soul is liberated from the body's captivity. No. Our bodies are just as much who we are as our souls. For it is only through our bodies that our soul can operate. We cannot know without our bodies because we have no other way of taking in information. We cannot serve without our bodies because we have no other way of relating our service to others without our bodies. We can't even love without our bodies. The only way we love anybody or anything is because we've experienced them some way with our bodies. Thus, our bodies are not disposable vessels. Rather, our bodies are sacred because they were set apart by God and given us to use so that we could know, love and serve God and our neighbors in this life in order to be with Him in the next.

Naturally, since our bodies are sacred, they cannot be used in ordinary ways, even after death has occurred. For instance, while it would be permissible to take our old, unusable car to the junkyard and let it rot, it is not permissible to do the same thing with our old, unusable bodies. This is why our bodies, even after death, must be treated with the utmost respect.

This is why the Church is so meticulous with a person's body after their death, especially if the body is cremated. For just as no one would ever scatter a loved one's arm here, leg there, eye there and nose somewhere else, so, too, the cremains are not permitted to be scattered. Rather, they must be placed in a worthy urn and inurned in a place suitable to the sacredness of the human body. The Church, after all, has to be just as careful about the person's body as their soul. For not only will both be one day reunited, but they are also both necessary for our loved one to be whole.
