Friends,

Believe it or not, when I was a kid, my parents forbid me from watching the "Dukes of Hazard". This was for multiple reasons. First, they were mean!! (haha). Second, the violence and sexual innuendo were unacceptable. Finally, and more importantly, was the blatant disregard for authority it contained. Of course, today, even the most naïve of eight-year olds probably considers the "Dukes of Hazard" hokey. But, I sometimes wonder if this is really because the "Dukes of Hazard" actually is hokey or have we just become so callous to the presence of evil in our society that it is more difficult for us to recognize the danger?

I would argue for the later. Part of the reason for this is found in Jesus' teaching in the gospel. For recall that in the gospels Jesus warns His disciples of the danger of scandal. "Whoever causes one of these little ones...to sin," Jesus says, "it would be better for him if a great millstone were put around his neck and he were thrown into the sea." That's how serious a problem scandal is. It is so grave that, according to Jesus, one would be better off dead rather than be guilty of it.

It is important to understand, however, that Jesus' understanding of scandal is a little different than our modern understanding of it. For Jesus, scandal is any behavior that encourages another to sin. However, we tend to think of scandal as something shocking perpetrated by important people. This incomplete understanding is a problem. For when we limit scandal to shocking behavior from important people, we will fail to see just how insidious scandal truly is.

You see, the true horror of scandal occurs not when the scandalous behavior is shocking, but, even more importantly, when it is not. After all, when scandal is shocking, it is eagerly and forcefully condemned by society. This is as it should be. For as Jesus Himself implies in today's gospel, few sins are worse than scandal.

But, counter intuitively, when the scandal is not shocking, it is then that scandal becomes even more serious. The reason why is because of the way God has designed us. After all, one of the great gifts God has given to human beings is the gift of a conscience. It is our conscience that encourages us, not only to keep up good behavior when we have done something good, but also convicts us of the evil present when we do bad.

It is here where the danger of scandal reveals its true ugliness. The pain of a guilty conscience is so profound, that we will do almost anything to alleviate it. Scandal provides us with shelter from the pain of our guilty conscience. After all, when others give us scandal, by pretending that our evil actions aren't really that bad, we are encouraged to rationalize that our evil behavior is not really wrong. This is devastating. For if we don't recognize the wrong in what we are doing, why in the world would we ever change? This is why scandal is so evil. It deafens to the call of our conscience to turn away from a bad behavior.

Of course, this problem can be seen in ever so many ways in our society. For instance, simply think about how many behaviors, once taboo in our culture, are now, not only accepted but, in some cases glorified. From women's fashion to couples living together before marriage, from chewing gum in Church to a general lack of respect for our elders, we must be constantly on our guard to the deadening of our consciences through scandal.

This is where frequent use of the sacrament of confession comes in. For not only does the light provided by the grace of this sacrament defend against scandal by enlightening areas that we may have rationalized away as not being as serious as they really are, but also confessing our sins to a priest makes us more accountable by forcing us to annunciate our sins more clearly.


