Friends.

This will come as a shock to most of you, but, believe it or not, I don't have a big mouth. In fact, when I was eleven years old both my dentist and my orthodontist confirmed that my mouth was so small that several teeth would have to be removed to prevent overcrowding. Worst of all, after enough new teeth emerged, I would still need braces.

It seems to me that something of similar process has been taking place with the Mass for the past hundred or so years. After all, what is the Mass, but the Church's mouth; the way we speak to God and He speaks to us. As early as the turn of the 20th century, Pope St. Pius X noticed that this mouth needed some readjusting. Participation at Mass was subdued to say the least. The priest would generally be up front doing his thing and the congregation in the back would be doing their thing. Seldom, if ever, did the two line up. About fifty years later, the Second Vatican Council met to discern how to address this issue. Of course, the council fathers envisioned a mass where the faithful would display full, active and conscious participation.

This was a brilliant goal. But, to implement this was going to require some major dental work. The role of the priest was dramatically changed. Laity were invited to participate in activities formerly reserved only to clerics. New opportunities for music were introduced. And, the Mass could now be prayed in the common language of the people rather than the official language of the Church, Latin,

Some fifty years after these new teeth of Vatican II have emerged, it became time for the braces. Notice, this is not because any of these teeth are corrupt and need to be removed. Rather, as these new teeth were emerging with the council, the Church was figuratively punched in the mouth by the Cultural Revolution of the late 1960s.

You see, the 'feel good' mentality of this era influenced some of the Church's new teeth in subtle, but destructive, ways. For instance, instead of viewing the Mass as worship, people began to think of the Mass as entertainment. Since entertainment 'felt good' in ways worship often did not; it was thought that, if you wanted people to get more out of Mass, you need to entertain them. Thus, the Mass became a type of show or play and ways of making the Mass more 'entertaining' were often attempted, sometimes in very strange ways.

But, this idea of Mass as entertainment turns worship on its ear. You see, if Mass is 'entertainment' then it is no longer about God. It is about us. If we feel entertained, then we think we got something out of Mass. If we don't, then we think that we did not.

The changes in the Mass from the Old Latin Mass to the new Mass in the vernacular were vulnerable to these shifts. Liberated from an enslavement to Latin, the priest was now able to incorporate his personality into the prayer of the Mass. Additionally, since the new Mass had more flexibility, it tempted the priest into inserting his own spin.

Unfortunately, this turns the priest into a 'showman' and not a minister. This is not only ecclesiastical nonsense, it's dangerous ecclesiastical nonsense! The main character is Jesus Christ. The priest's role is not to entertain the crowd, but to help the congregation encounter Jesus Christ through the Mass. With more flexibility in the rituals and more familiarity with the language, the priest became the focus of the Mass and not Jesus Christ.

This has some clear consequences. After all, if we think of the Mass as entertainment, then we're always tempted to go to the better show. Well, I don't like Fr. No-personality over at St. Whatshisname as much as Fr. Fun-guy over at St. Lets-party, so I'm going there. Since the priest is human and wants affirmation like all humans do, he is tempted to put on a better show than his 'competition'.

As this entertainment mindset is deepened, the Mass ends up being destroyed. After all, the Mass is not about Fr. No-personality or Fr. Fun-guy. It's about Jesus Christ! And He's always there, whether we are entertained or not!! We receive an inestimable blessing from the Mass regardless of how entertained we may feel. For even if we don't receive Jesus Christ, body, blood, soul and divinity in the Eucharist, we are still purified, like spiritual chemotherapy, just by being in His presence. This happens infallibly, at each and every Mass, whether we feel entertained or not!
