

What are Mass Intentions?

One part of Catholic culture that is sometimes hard to understand and very often misunderstood is the custom of offering Mass intentions.

When a priest celebrates Mass each day, he *offers* each celebration of the Eucharist for a particular person, or intention. By doing so he applies special graces from God upon that person or intention.

Similar to how we are able to intercede for others by our personal prayers, the Church is able to intercede for us through the celebration of the Mass. However, since the Eucharist is the "source and summit of the Christian life" the Mass possesses a power that our personal prayers do not.

The practice of offering Mass for particular intentions is an ancient one, dating back to the early Church. Pope Paul VI said, "The Mass is the most perfect form of prayer!" It has immense power and countless miracles and conversions have occurred throughout the centuries by offering Masses for a specific intention or person. Mass intentions are a great treasure of the Church and have a spiritual weight that is incalculable.

Ultrasounds Save Lives (2,157 in fact)

Since 2009 the Nebraska Knights of Columbus Culture of Life Foundation (COL) has placed a total of **ten** ultrasound machines in qualifying Women's Resource Centers throughout Nebraska. The first one was placed in Kearney in 2009. Others have been placed in North Platte, Grand Island, Hastings, O'Neill, and in four facilities in the Omaha area.

We asked the ten facilities, with ultrasound machines in place by 2018, the question; "In 2018, how many abortion minded and/or abortion vulnerable women received an ultrasound, and after seeing the results, chose not to abort?" With eight of the ten facilities responding, the total number of ultrasounds given was 2558. Of that number, 2157 women chose not to abort after viewing the ultrasound. That is more than 84% of the women that were able to view their baby and see the heartbeat, felt the need to keep their baby and not abort.

The COL is funded mainly through the One Rose-One Life campaign which is sponsored and carried out by local Knights of Columbus Councils in parishes statewide on or near January 22, the anniversary of the 1973, Roe v. Wade Supreme Court decision.

The "Ultrasound Initiative," is a program started in 2009, by the Knights of Columbus Supreme Council, which has close to two million members, to help place ultrasound machines in qualifying Women's Resource Centers throughout the United States and worldwide. Supreme typically pays half of the cost of a machine with the other half coming from the state or local Councils. Since its conception, over 1,000 ultrasound machines have been placed, saving countless babies lives.

Look for a <u>"One Rose-One Life"</u> campaign coming soon to a parish near you, so you too, can help save lives. Your donations make a difference.
