Friends,

What do you suppose the chances are of Lebron James, the best basketball player in the world, giving up his job in the NBA, to take a much more thankless and less lucrative job like an ordinary person? Of course, it doesn't seem very likely. Not only would he have to sacrifice millions if not billions of dollars, but he would also have to sacrifice the comforts of a luxurious lifestyle as well.

Seen in this light, the love of Jesus Christ takes on a new depth. Jesus' sacrifice of assuming our human nature is infinitely crazier than anything done by Lebron James. However, Jesus' humiliations don't end when He condescends to become one of His silly, talking creatures. In fact, they only begin. You see, even though Jesus is truly God, He is also truly man. As a true

man, Jesus was not permitted to avoid the process of maturing that all human beings undergo.

As we all know, the way anyone fully matures is by listening and obeying, not just his parents but his teachers and his elders as well. And this might be a little more difficult for Jesus than we might think. After all, His humanity, just like ours, is limited by a multitude of factors, including heredity. For instance, if Mary wasn't athletic, chances are Jesus wasn't athletic. If Mary wasn't good in school, chances are Jesus wasn't good in school.

Of course, obeying would be no picnic for Jesus either. Sure, His mother is sinless, everyone else responsible for raising Jesus is not. Joseph is not. His teachers are not. The scribes, Pharisees and other religious leaders are not. And yet, Jesus always chooses to obey them, even when they are wrong. This is seen most perfectly with His crucifixion. Jesus humbly obeys

the unjust sentence of Pilate, in part, because Pilate is the one with such authority.

Perhaps now we can see better why humility is so central to the Christian understanding of spirituality. For the way a person is best able to demonstrate the depth of his love, best able to become more like Jesus, is by the practice of humility. Notice what this means about obedience. Obedience is the handmaid of humility. After all, the one sure-fire way to humble oneself is by being obedient to those entrusted with authority, whether they be parents, bosses, politicians or churchmen. This is especially true when such folks seem unreasonable or even unjust in their demands. For it is then that we have the best opportunity to become like Jesus Christ, who was obedient even to the point of accepting an unjust sentence of death.

Nowhere is the opportunity to obey more prevalent than within the context of our families. Not only are children called to obey their parents, but also husbands and wives are called to obey each other as a sign of their love for their beloved. In fact, there aren't many sacrifices harder than submitting our will to the will of another. Last, but certainly not least, all of us, as

members of God's family, are called to obey the Church, who God has bequeathed as our mother.

Unfortunately, we often struggle as much listening to this mother as we did listening to our biological mothers as kids. After all, how many of us struggle, or even refuse, to pay attention at all, to our mother's advice on the serious issues plaguing our world like abortion, contraception, so called "gay-marriage", consumerism, materialism, the environment, the death

penalty, just wars, and just about anything else?

But, perhaps just like the teenager who discovers in his twenties that his parents suddenly got a heck of a lot smarter since his teenage years, maybe we, too, can discover that the Church, our mother, has a little more insight than we might have previously thought. This is why, if there is an issue in the Church that you struggle with, I encourage you to follow Jesus' example of humility, by setting aside what you think you know for a moment and read with an open mind what the Church says on that particular subject. The internet is full of authentic and easy to understand explanations of our Catholic faith. Sometimes all it takes a little humility to begin to listen.


