A message from Fr Olsen

I just wanted to share an update on the status of the High Altar. At the last Finance Committee meeting, a proposal was accepted from Mark's Custom Woodworking for the construction of a high altar (the outline can be found on the reverse side.) The project cost is \$17,340, and the entire amount has been raised. The altar is scheduled to be in before Easter and will be stained to match the woodwork currently in the church.

As you can see on the outline, there are places for three statues. A statue of the Sacred Heart is going to be in the middle, with a statue of the Blessed Mother His right and St. Joseph on his left. These statues have not been ordered yet, but a few people have expressed interest in donating towards that. One thing that will change in the draft is that, instead of having a relief of the Last Supper in the base, there will be a different design instead.

The high altar serves an important purpose in our church. First, it draws immediate attention to Jesus. As the center of the Church, the high altar is designed to capture the attention of anyone entering the church to help them recognize that the church building is a building different than any other building we are ever. This is one of the reasons why a high altar must be captivating, both is size and in ornamentation. It is supposed to capture the attention of everyone entering the Church immediately so that they can focus on Jesus Christ. I think this design does just that.

The second reason the high altar must be impressive is because of the occupant who resides there. The high altar is, effectively, the bedroom of Jesus Christ. I would hope that if Jesus were to move to Lindsay, we would build Him the nicest house we could. Well, the Church is Jesus house (and also about the nicest building in Lindsay!) Would we really want the bedroom of Our Lord and King to be anything less? Our new high altar accomplishes this while retaining continuity with the integrity and the noble simplicity of our current building.
