COVID VIRUS UPDATE

This week's teleconference call with the Governor and the East Central District Health Department discussed, recommended and implemented the following.

The Governor said again to go to testnebraska.com website to sign up to be tested to see if you have had the virus and have developed an immunity. Once the tests are done it may help in relaxing certain DHM in a particular area.

Nebraska is expected to peak within the next week so staying home, social distancing and wearing a mask are very important.

Baseball/softball practices may now start on June 1st with June 18th the date that contests may start. There are numerous guidelines and stipulations that must be done in order to practice and play. The village will be meeting with the coaches within the next 10 days to finalize plans.

Memorial Day celebrations were discussed again and recommendations are to have the 21-gun salute at the cemeteries with individuals remaining in their cars during the military salutes and if they get out the 10 person and social distancing rules would have to be followed.

The CDC list of symptoms are, Fever, Cough, Shortness of Breath, Chills, Repeated shaking with chills, Muscle pain, Headache, Sore Throat and loss of Taste or Smell.

The size of groups remains at Ten (10) for now with no date as to when that number may be increased. We will still have the six (6') foot social distancing requirement until a vaccine is found.

STAY HOME:

If you feel sick don't go to work or out in the public (seek assistance from others)
It is recommended that no un-necessary travel be taken out of the home especially out of state.

STAY HEALTHY:

It was recommended to avoid close contact and keep maintaining the social distancing of at least 6 feet between people, wash hands frequently with soap and warm water and no group gatherings of more than 10 people.

STAY CONNECTED:

Listen to the radio, watch TV and read for updates on the COVID-19 virus given by the Governor, State Health Department and the CDC.

REMINDER: The Village Park equipment, restrooms and shelters as well as the playground equipment east of the school are closed. We will monitor what the Governor, the Health Department and Direct Health Measures are in place and adjust as needed. Remember the Virus can live on plastic and steel for up to 3 days.

The phone meetings with the Governor and the ECDHD will be going on for the foreseeable future.
