Friends.

Every gift comes with responsibility. Whether it's the small child's artwork that must be dutifully placed on the refrigerator door or the gaudy Father's Day tie that must be worn, if only once; failing to make use of a gift is almost always hurtful to the giver. The gifts of God are no different. Just like any gift, the gifts we receive from God are given to us to be used.

This is particularly true of the gift of our Catholic Faith. In fact, the Catholic Faith is the greatest of all possible gifts, not only because it best prepares us for eternal life, but also because it is the best path to happiness in this life. This is something that is easily forgotten. Living the truth of our Catholic Faith is not some arduous burden that must be endured. It is a joy-filled blessing because it gives us the brightest path to authentic temporal happiness.

But just like all other gifts, our Catholic Faith is a gift that must be used. In fact, the prophet Ezekiel accentuates the grave responsibility that all of God's prophets, including us, have in proclaiming God's Word. The Lord says to Ezekiel, "I have appointed you a watchman for the house of Israel. If I tell the wicked that they shall die and you do not relay this message, the wicked shall die for his guilt, but I will hold you responsible for his death. But if you warn the wicked...and he refuses to turn from his ways, he shall die for his guilt, but you shall save yourself." The lesson of this short reading is clear. All of us blessed with the fullness of truth that is the Catholic Faith have the grave responsibility of sharing this gift with others.

This can be a problem for us today, especially given our modern society's passion for what it calls tolerance. Of course, tolerance, when properly understood, is a virtuous action. But, unlike the implicit claim of many in our society, tolerance is not the supreme Christian virtue. In fact, tolerance of sinful behavior can itself be sinful. Not only can tolerance of sin imply the condoning of sin, but such tolerance also runs contrary to the explicit command of Jesus in the gospel of St. Matthew. In that gospel, Jesus tells His disciples, "If your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault, between you and him alone."

Notice two things. First, Jesus wants His disciples to point out the faults of their brothers. The reason why should be clear. If we have been given the great gift of the fullness of truth that leads to human happiness, we must share so that others can know this truth and be set free. Additionally, when we fail to share this gift of knowledge of right and wrong with our neighbor, we are putting the lamp God lit in us under a bushel basket. Consequently, we run the risk of the condemnation promised by the prophet Ezekiel.

Second, the starting point for this is not the public forum, be it the coffee shop or the local bar or twitter. Rather, when pointing out the faults of others, Jesus tells His disciples to do it privately and face to face so that no scandal or embarrassment may occur. It is only after that hasn't worked is the public disclosure of failings necessary. When you have exhausted every other option, the sole hope for the brother's recognition of his sinful behavior is now the reprimand of the authorities.

But, Father, it might be argued, Jesus would be appalled at such intolerant behavior. After all, isn't it Jesus who gave us the golden rule; "do unto others as you would have them do unto you?" Additionally, I seem to remember Jesus saying that you should remove the plank from your own eye before trying to remove the speck from your brother's. What about loving your

Of course, before we were to ever point out the failings of someone else, we must listen carefully to these words of Jesus. We must strive diligently to remove the weakness present in our own lives before confronting the weakness of others. But, the fact that we, too, are sinful, the fact that we, too, are human, does not eliminate our responsibility to confront sinful behavior.

But, the only way this can be legitimately done is because of love. If we really love our brother who is sinning, then we would want, more than anything else, more than his esteem, more than his friendliness and even more than his affection, to help him overcome the sinful behavior that is keeping him, not just from God, but from the community as well. Our motivation for correcting is not self-righteousness or pride or because they offend us, but rather it is love.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained:

Calling Priests Father

Question:

Why do Catholics call priests Father?

Answer:

One of the common objections evangelical Christians have to Catholics is our practice of calling priests by the title Father. They will often cite a passage in Matthew's Gospel in which Jesus tells his followers: "Call no one on earth your father; you have but one Father in heaven" (23:19). It seems pretty straightforward, but when we put this verse in context, we see that Jesus is speaking out against religious leaders who had forgotten what their proper role was and who were bad examples through their own hypocrisy and elitist attitudes.

In other Gospels, we find Jesus himself using the title father for different characters, such as in the Parable of Lazarus and the Rich Man (Luke 16:19-31)) and the Parable of the Prodigal Son (Luke 15:11-32). If we put the verse from Matthew into the full scope of Jesus' teachings, he isn't saying that we can't use words like "father," "rabbi," or "master." Rather, he is telling us that we should be mindful of the full meaning of those titles and not to misuse them.

To call a priest "Father" is more than a sign of respect for the office of the priesthood. It goes all the way back to the way St. Paul understood his own work as a missionary and evangelizer. Paul wrote, "I am writing you in this way not to shame you but to admonish you as my beloved children ... It was I who begot you in Christ Jesus through my preaching of the Gospel. I beg you, then, be imitators of me. This is why I have sent you Timothy, my beloved and faithful son in the Lord" (1 Corinthians 4:14-17).

Yes, we have God alone as our heavenly Father, but there are also those here with us who nurture and nourish our faith through their teaching and care. This is why the title of Father has been applied to the church's pastors in different ways since the earliest days of the Church, including monks and nuns using the title "abbot" and "abbess" (from abba) for their spiritual leaders and Christians around the world recognizing the "Holy Father" or "pope" (from papa) as the head of the family that is the Church. The title Father is a reminder that priests have a special responsibility to care for, protect, feed, listen to, and nourish those who have been entrusted to them, all after the example of our Father in heaven who never ceases to give us what we truly need.

GOSPEL MEDITATION Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

When we were baptized, we were baptized into Christ's death. Take a moment to ponder these profound words. We were baptized into death. In every sense of the word, we are asked to die. This is not just about our final death but about daily deaths due to inconvenience, discomfort, pain, loss, or others' needs. This is an incredible epiphany given the way we very often approach our lives. We do everything to avoid death, let alone encounter it! Many avoid pain, discomfort, inconvenience, uneasiness, change, interference, and suffering of any kind. We put a lot of energy into finding the easiest and least inconvenient way through many things. Even holding the door open for a stranger or saying hello to someone in the store can be major undertakings.

We are called to die. One of the biggest wake-up calls we can have is realizing that life is not about us! There are millions of other people sharing life on this planet with whom I have a relationship. Does my life celebrate those relationships? The most distracting question we can ask is, "What do I want to do?" The more focused, faith-filled question is, "What do I need to do?" What I need to do may not be what I want to do. However, asking this question more frequently will teach us how to more purposefully and intentionally live so we can be a life giving vessel for others. When we learn to live more sacrificially, to put the needs of others before our own, and to not always seek our own self-interest, we become aware of what baptism into Christ's death is really all about. These are the roots of virtue and the seedbed for justice, tolerance, solidarity, love, and peace.

Learning how to accept all the "small deaths" and sacrifices life calls us to teaches us how to approach our final death. All deaths ask us to empty ourselves into something or someone else. 


