Friends,

When I started studying theology seriously several years ago, one of the first things I tried to discover was a list of every mortal sin. This seemed tremendously important to me because mortal sin is a sin serious enough to kill our relationship with God. In fact, anyone dying with unconfessed mortal sins on their soul, even if it is only one, is eternally damned to hell. Thus, it seems important to know what those sins are. In fact, no such list exists because, for a sin to be mortal three things are necessary. The sin is serious, it is fully known, and the person committing the sin consents to it sufficiently.

Let's begin with the first requirement. Although all sins are serious, some sins are graver than others. For instance, sins like murder are graver than sins like cursing. However, even within types of sin, some sins are still graver than others are. Stealing an apple from Bill Gates is not as grave as stealing that same apple from someone who needs it for their supper, although both are wrong. Lying about a surprise birthday party is not as grave as lying under oath, although both are wrong. The examples could go on and on.

The first thing we must determine in discovering if a sin is mortal is whether the sin we've committed is a grave matter. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, "Grave matter is specified by the 10 Commandments, correspond to the answer of Jesus to the rich young man: 'Do not kill. Do not commit adultery. Do not steal. Do not bear false witness. Do not defraud. Honor your father and mother." Any direct violation of these commandments is likely a grave matter, as is worshipping a false god, taking the name of the Lord in vain, and failing to keep holy the Lord's day, especially by not attending mass when obliged.

However, even if someone has sinned gravely in one of these ways multiple times, it is possible that they are still not guilty of even one mortal sin. You see, in addition to grave matter, mortal sins require full knowledge and complete consent.

To have full knowledge means the perpetrator has knowledge both of the sinful character of the act and its opposition to God's law. If one doesn't know that what they are doing is gravely sinful and violates God's law, then such a grave sin is not mortal. This is why the Aborigine in Australia is not going to hell for missing mass when there is an obligation to go. Since he had no knowledge that this was gravely sinful, he certainly cannot be guilty of mortal sin.

As Catholics we must be as careful with our understanding of full knowledge. Not knowing something we should have known does not excuse us. Just like the police officer is not going to accept our ignorance of the speed limit as an excuse for speeding, so, too, God is not going to accept our ignorance of something we should have known as an excuse for our grave sin. As Confirmed Catholics, all of us have accepted responsibility for knowing certain things are right and certain things are wrong.

Of course, even if our sin is grave and even if we know full well (or should have known full well) that it is grave, it still may not be a mortal sin. We must still consent to this sin sufficiently. This criterion is hard to get a handle on because it deals with the mystery of human woundedness and human psychology.

For instance, suppose a woman has an abortion. Clearly the killing of an innocent child is a grave matter. It's also difficult to argue that a person didn't know, or, at least, could not have known that killing a child in the womb is a grave matter. However, it may be quite common that this sin is not mortal precisely because the fear preying on the woman at this time may have diminished her ability to freely choose this action. If some factor inhibits her freedom, her sin may or may not be mortal.

What should we do if we are unsure if we've committed a mortal sin? The answer is simple. Go to confession immediately. It's not like going to confession is going to hurt us if the sin is not mortal. None of us want to monkey around with serious sins because the consequences are eternal.






