Friends,

Like many in this part of the world, I love being outdoors. Thus, I so appreciate that Pope Francis' first letter to the world was a reflection on the environment. The pope recognizes that one of our greatest resources is the world that is entrusted to our care. His argument is that we are ruining it, which is irrefutable.

To see this, understand that everything in nature regenerates. From the air to the water to the tree to the animal everything eventually reconstitutes into some other cog in the constant cycle of nature. For instance, the air we breathe is used by us to benefit plant life, and conversely used by plants to benefit us. Water falls from the sky to be used in nature until it is cycled back through to be redistributed by the sky.

Man, as the pinnacle of nature, is no different. However, man is living a regenerative cycle that is faster than nature. The pope uses the example of paper. The trees that are responsible for paper would eventually become the same compost for future growth regardless of whether man used them for paper or not. However, since man is using them for paper, he has sped up the process faster than nature can

According to the Pope, the reason for this is man's selfishness. In a society that increasingly views the goods of creation as tools to satisfy every desire, man becomes the master of creation rather than its steward. Our throw-away culture is now abusing creation to the point that the earth is crying out in pain.

The pope rightly identifies unregulated market economics as a culprit in this phenomenon. Since unregulated markets have profit as their primary motive, the temptation is to set aside long-term happiness with short-term pleasure. Is it any wonder why corporations so often move their plants to countries with less regulation and cheaper labor? Their interest is not in the long-term good of the world, but the short term good of stockholders.

This has effects, as the pope points out, on both the environment as well as the poor. Unregulated market economics tends to exploit the resources of poor countries while, at the same time, doing as little as possible for the long-term benefit of the people living there. The only "benefit" for countries stripped of their natural resources is to those in power so that the rich become richer, while the poor end up forfeiting their rich natural resources for what is essentially pennies on the dollar, because those "pennies" are more than they've ever had before.

This is why the pope pines for a new system of "ecology". This makes those reading this document from a political perspective either very nervous or very excited depending on your leanings. You see, if the pope is highlighting the dangers of unregulated market capitalism, and you are reading it from a political perspective, you cannot avoid the conclusion that the pope is endorsing socialism or even communism. This, however, is not the case. The pope isn't proposing a specific existing model, but only highlighting the problem at hand.

You really don't have to go very far to see something needs to change. I can't tell you how disappointing it is to drive 800 miles to an old logging road in the Canadian wilderness, as I do every year, drive down that logging road 20 miles to a boat landing, take a 40-mile boat ride up a river system to a lake, portage around a rapids to a lake that has only been fished once that year and find garbage littering the shore; or, to go to the Gavins Point Dam and find trash strewn along the banks of the river. This is all happening in a regulated part of the world with people that probably take more care of their resources than most places in the world. Think about what it's like in big cities, especially those in other parts of the world.

This is why you don't have to buy man-made global warming or climate change, or buy that capitalism is evil, to buy the pope's argument. The pope, following the historical teachings of the Church, is highlighting the dangers of something called "consumerism". Consumerism occurs when man, in his selfishness, sees himself as the end of the line of production rather than a cog in the vast tapestry that is nature. As we devolve into a more and more instant-gratification society, we view ourselves more and more as the end of production rather than as part of a vast cycle that is constantly regenerating. If we break that cycle, there are devastating effects, not just for the environment around us, but for us as well. In fact, the pope, quite insightfully, views abortion and other life issues as a "fruit" of this type of consumerism. If the child is not a service to me then why not dispose of it like I dispose of a pop can. If grandma is no longer of service to me, why not end her life. Consumerism is not just an economic issue. It is a life issue as well.
