Friends,

Not many things are more important to us and more personal than our names. Isn't this part of the reason why parents undergo such pains in naming their children? They know how important names truly are.

Seen in this light, the 16th chapter of St. Matthew takes on new depth. In that chapter Jesus essentially asks His disciples if they know His name. "And you," Jesus says, "Who do you say that I am?" After a brief but awkward silence, Simon Peter responds, "You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God." Jesus so appreciates Simon's recognition of this until now hidden name of Jesus, that He rewards Simon with a name of his own. "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah," Jesus says, "for flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my heavenly Father. And so I say to you, you are [now called] Peter."

However, unlike my sister and brother-in-law, who threaten me with excommunication from their household whenever I try to rename their children, the parents of Simon Peter would have undoubtedly rejoiced at having their authority usurped by Jesus. After all, whenever God renames someone in the Sacred Scriptures, He always does so both as a response to faith and as an indication of a new mission. This is why Abram became Abraham, why Jacob became Israel, and why Saul became Paul. With Peter's response of faith, His new mission is to be the rock upon which Jesus will build His Church.

It is here that we see one of the greatest puns of all time. For when Jesus gives the name "Peter" to Simon, it has more significance than simply the exchanging of one name for another. You see, in Greek, the name Peter means rock. So when Jesus says to Simon, "You are Peter, and on this rock I will build my Church," He is literally saying, "You are Rock and on this rock I will build my Church." As a result, the meaning could not be clearer. The Church founded by Jesus Christ is founded upon the rock that is St. Peter.

It is important to note how Jesus describes the Church that He founded upon the rock that is St. Peter. Notice what Jesus says to Peter. "I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven. Whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven." With this gift, the authority of St. Peter as the head of the Church is revealed.

St. Peter is not given these keys merely as a symbolic gesture. Peter is also given the authority to use them as he sees fit. This is why we call St. Peter, the Vicar of Christ and the first pope. As Christ's Vicar, it is Peter who stands in for Jesus once Jesus has ascended back to His heavenly Father. His successors share in this office.

This type of authority both demands and deserves respect. Yet I don't know how many times I have heard even Catholics say that the pope is wrong about abortion or contraception or divorce or so-called gay marriage or just wars or the death penalty or refugees or some other moral or doctrinal issue. This is extremely dangerous. As Jesus makes clear, the papacy was established by Jesus Himself to serve as His personal representative here on earth.

This is yet another reason why humble obedience is so important to the practice of Christianity. For it is this virtue that helps us best imitate Jesus Christ. So if there is a particular doctrine that our Church teaches that we struggle with, strive to avoid condemning that teaching as antiquated, irrelevant or just plain wrong. Rather, seek understanding by listening to what the Church is saying. For if that issue involves faith or morals, one thing is certain. When you listen to the Church, you hear the voice of Jesus Christ.

*SCHOOL LUNCH NUTRITION PROGRAM - FREE/REDUCED LUNCH PROGRAM:

The Nebraska Department of Education's Nutrition Services office has announced the Income Eligibility Guidelines for free and reduced price meals for persons unable to pay the full price of meals served under the National School Lunch Program. Application forms have been mailed to all St. Francis School family households this last week with a letter to parents.

To apply for free or reduced price meals, households should fill out the application and return it to Lisa Krings at the parish office. Additional copies are available from Lisa as well. The information provided on the application will be used to determine eligibility. For the school to determine eligibility, the household must provide the following information on the application: names of all household members; the last four digits of the social security number of an adult household member or a statement that the household member does not have one; total monthly household income by source; and the signature of an adult household member certifying that the information provided is correct.

Children who are members of Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) assistance units or Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) or Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR) households are automatically eligible to receive free meals.

Applications may be submitted at any time during the year, but benefits will not begin until the application has been submitted and approved.

The same meals will be made available to all enrolled students regardless of race, color, sex, age, national origin or disability, and there is no discrimination in the course of the meal service. St. Francis provides free and reduced price meals to those meeting the approved eligibility criteria.
