Friends.

Although the words "Catholic" and "Christian" are often used interchangeably, they are not the same. Of course, all Catholics are Christians but not all Christians are Catholics, but there is one more fundamental difference from which all others differences flow. That difference is the understanding of the Eucharist. As Catholics, we believe that the bread and wine offered by the priest at Mass is truly changed into the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus. Although no change is perceptible to the senses, Catholics understand that this true presence of Jesus is so real that the only difference between the Jesus described in the gospels and the Jesus present in our churches is cosmetic. They don't look the same.

This is either true or it is false. The fact that Catholics believe this to be true doesn't make it true any more than the fact that non-Catholics disbelieve it makes it false. This change either happens or it doesn't, which means either Catholics are right, or Catholics are wrong. There is no other alternative.

Let's suppose we are wrong. If Jesus isn't truly present in the Eucharist, this makes us idolaters. We genuflect entering the pew because we recognize the presence of God. We adore, worship and honor the Eucharist at Mass as if it is God. If we are wrong, we are not only idolaters, but the worst of idolaters as well. We are not only worshipping bread as if it were God, we are encouraging others to do the same. If the Catholic Church is wrong about this, then we are truly anti-Christ, and, as such, should be condemned by all Christians, including ourselves.

But, what if we are right. If Jesus truly is present in the Eucharist, maybe that makes us even worse. After all, the insensitivity we show by what we wear in Jesus' house; how we behave in Jesus' house; how we consume Jesus in Holy Communion no differently than if we were eating a potato chip; how we receive Jesus with hands dirtied, not from the glory of hard work, but from the filth of sin; into mouths soiled by gossip, lying, name-calling, into hearts infested with selfishness, self-centeredness and self-importance...all with no thought of confessing our unworthiness beforehand. How we receive Jesus unworthily because we know we have sinned gravely and not confessed at all is arguably worse than worshipping bread as God. How often do we give this no thought?

Of course, this insensitivity has very profound, real-world consequences. Is it really a wonder why we are so self-centered, selfish, and narcissistic in everything from the way we drive to being inconvenienced at the grocery store? We seldom see the presence of Jesus Christ in our neighbor, unless they are serving us. There's next to no effort to love our enemy, as Jesus commands us, precisely because we can't see the presence of Jesus in them. In short, our insensitivity to Jesus in the Eucharist makes the world more like hell where the presence of God is unseen than like heaven where God is omnipresent.

Fortunately, there is a cure... Eucharistic Adoration. Not only is this "a" cure, it is the ONLY cure. If Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist, as we claim to believe, then it is only by being in His presence that we can begin to recognize His presence. Or, to put it another way, Eucharistic Adoration is like spiritual chemotherapy. Simply being in the presence of Our Lord burns away the cancer of our selfishness and makes us more sensitive to the presence of Jesus in our world.

This is also why it is soooooo incredibly difficult for us to commit to making Eucharistic Adoration a priority. The devil knows how powerful it is. He will unleash every lie in his arsenal to prevent us from making that commitment.

The two most obvious lies are (1) we are too busy and (2) we don't know what to do. Clearly, none of us are too busy for the things we really care about. If we really cared about spending time with the Lord, we would make the time like we would for any important family function. The uncomfortable truth is we just don't care enough. Additionally, we all know what to do...pray. We just don't want to do it because it would be uncomfortable, unfamiliar and we don't want to learn. Heck, even if we went before the Lord and played on our phone it would be immensely more beneficial than playing with our phone in front of the TV.

The fact that we find these two lies so persuasive is the best sign of how important Eucharistic Adoration is. The devil is working overtime to keep this from happening in our parish. Rather than give up, we need to man up. Jesus is never outdone in generosity. One hour a week may seem like a lot, but try it for a year and see what the Lord does in return.
