Friends,

Competition, like any gift, can be both a strength and a weakness. On the one hand, competition is extremely beneficial. Without competition, the talents of a Michael Jordan or a Tiger Woods would never have the chance to develop so profoundly. On the other hand, competition can become extremely destructive. For instance, many will lie, cheat or steal all in the name of competition. When it is used, not as a motivation for developing talents and skills, but as an excuse to destroy another, competition becomes problematic.

Yet, there is one venue in which competition is always destructive...our spiritual life. This is demonstrated quite profoundly in Jesus' parable of the talents. In this parable, Jesus recounts a rich man entrusting a number of talents to his servants. To one servant, he bequeaths five talents, to another two and to a third one.

What kind of return does the rich man get on his investment? Two of his servants were diligent with their stewardship and doubled the talents entrusted to them. However, the third servant was afraid of failing. He chose to bury his lone talent in the ground. And for his lack of stewardship, this third servant has his lone talent taken from him and given to the first servant.

Now, in Jesus' day, a talent was a term applied to a large measure of wealth. In fact, one talent was approximately equal to one hundred pounds of silver. To put this in perspective, recall that Judas betrayed Jesus for a measly thirty PIECES of silver. Thus, for the rich man to entrust even one talent to his servants would have meant entrusting him with something of supreme

Although the talent Jesus is referring to in today's gospel is a huge sum of money, there is a striking parallel between this monetary unit called a talent and the talents we receive from God as gifts. Both are of inestimable value. Both are gifts. And, both require good stewardship if they are to be returned profitably.

There is one crucial difference between these types of talents. While monetary talents are easily quantified, the talents and gifts we receive from God are not. In fact, throughout our life, we are continually deepening our appreciation of the multitude of talents and gifts we have received from God, as well as constantly becoming aware of new ones. This is why competition in the spiritual life is devastating. If we don't even know how we are responding to our own talents and gifts, how can we compare ourselves to others, whose talents and gifts are even more mysterious?

Yet, simply think about how often we compare ourselves to others in spiritual matters. Well, at least I'm not like so and so that doesn't come to Mass or comes to Mass late or leaves Mass early. Or, at least I'm not like so and so who gossips all the time, or whose kids get into trouble, or uses foul language. Or, at least I'm not like so and so who drinks, or who is in an invalid marriage, or runs around. In these and an infinite number of other cases, the comparisons that arise from our competition with others destroy us. How?

First, these comparisons tempt us into a false sense of security. We might muse, "Since I do more, than I am sure to go to heaven." Hogwash! How do we know that God hasn't given us ten talents? Five we might be using very well to accomplish many good things. However, we might have buried the other five in the ground. Wouldn't this make us five times worse than the third servant in this parable?

Second, how do we know what talents and gifts God has given others? It could be that the person who struggles with Mass, kids, language, alcohol or sex was given only 10% of one talent from God but is making the most of it. Even though they are seemingly less productive, they may be much more like the servants who maximized their talents than we are.

The bottom line is this. We simply have almost no idea how God is working in our own lives, let alone how God is working in the lives of others. So, rather than competing with others, we need to use that gift of competition to better ourselves.



GOSPEL MEDITATION Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

God gives us the gift of His very self and asks us to invest it. Investing God's greatest gift of Himself wisely, allows God's kingdom to grow and flourish. God trusts us with this pearl of great price in hopes that it will produce abundant fruit. While God's gift of self is realized in the gifts of faith, hope, and love, they are not meant to be solely for personal benefit. They are intended to be shared and are at the heart of Jesus' blueprint for happiness, the Beatitudes.

When we properly invest God's greatest gift, His most treasured possession, we invest in the wellbeing of all of our brothers and sisters and the world in which we live. We take up most seriously our call to be stewards and properly manage, not only our own affairs, but the affairs of those around and before us. God has put tremendous confidence in us. Do we have that same confidence in God?

We often go the extra mile and put in the additional effort when it comes to those concerns closest to us: our families, friends, careers, home and securities. But when it comes to things that are not as close to us, we can become lax and less conscientious. Tending to God's treasure requires a great deal of focus and persistent hard work. It demands that I see the bigger picture, God's picture, in which self-sacrifice is a given as we labor for the establishment of God's kingdom, God's vision. Fear and a lack of trust can loom large, however. We are afraid of letting go of what is "mine" and apprehensive of jeopardizing what we have in order to venture into something bigger and more promising.

Fear and a lack of trust serve no purpose in God's kingdom. They benefit neither the person nor God. What is required is a courageous resolve that produces the fortitude necessary to stay the course and do what God is asking. Doing all in our power to cultivate the seeds of faith, hope, and love in our world, working diligently to put all of our relationships in proper order, becoming attentive to systems and ideologies that hurt and oppress people, being mindful of injustice, and laboring on behalf of the poor and the needy are at the core of what each of us is asked to do. It is how we invest God's most precious gift wisely. If persistent, alert and attentive, then life will gradually improve around us, there will be greater peace and we will experience joy.
