Friends,

The word "Christmas" is no accident. It comes from an Old English expression meaning Christ's Mass. The reason why may be obvious. Christmas and the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass have so much in common. At Christmas, God the Son was born into the world veiled in human flesh. At Mass, God the Son is born into the world veiled by the appearance of bread and wine. At Christmas, angels announced His birth singing "Glory to God in the highest and on earth peace to people of good will". At Mass, these same angels join us in echoing this same refrain. At Christmas, God the Son set aside the dignity of His divinity to take on the limitations of our humanity. At Mass, God the Son again sets aside His dignity to become nourishment for our human soul and does so over and over. Notice what is at the core of these similarities... Sacrifice! For just as the sacrifice of God the Son at Christmas brought joy to the world, so, too, can the sacrifice of God the Son be re-presented at each Mass and can bring joy to our lives.

Imagine this. If an alien from another galaxy came to this planet in a spaceship and wanted to announce his arrival to the human race, he would undoubtedly use every single media outlet and interrupt every single event everywhere in the world to broadcast his message. Yet, the announcement of the birth of God made man is made to an insignificant group of shepherds in an isolated region of one of the smallest provinces on the furthest outskirts of the Roman Empire. God is born into human flesh and most of the world has no idea.

This is only the beginning of Jesus' sacrifices. After His birth, God the Son sacrificed His dignity for things like pottytraining. Even worse, God so emptied Himself of His dignity that He even endured an unjust sentence of death. Think about this for a minute. The child whose birth we celebrate at Christmas will be crucified unjustly and mercilessly at the very hands of the people He came to save – specifically all of us.

Jesus continues to empty Himself in our day, each and every day, to be "born" each and every time Mass is celebrated. You see, Jesus loved us so much that He didn't simply do His thing on earth, retreat to heaven and say 'that's how you do it.' No. Our God continues to empty Himself every day in the Eucharist.

Each Mass is like a "mini Christmas". At each Mass, Jesus, the second Person of the Blessed Trinity, takes on an appearance that is even more demeaning to Him than our humanity was - the appearance of bread and wine. It is only when we detach ourselves from our stuff, and make space in our hearts to receive this gift, that God can not only fill us with joy, but pour His love into us so super-abundantly that our joy infects those close to us.

But, do we let this happen? Or have we filled our hearts with so much "stuff" that there's no room for God's love. And perhaps this might give us pause as we celebrate Christmas. You see, we often forget how blessed we are. After all, many in the world may not be blessed to be able to enjoy Christmas like we do. In fact, how many families in our world will celebrate Christmas without toys, without gifts of any kind, without friends, without family, without food or without homes? When you stop to think about it, we sure have a lot to be grateful for! Has the "stuff" in our lives made us unaware of this reality?

Of course, there is an even more important reason for us to be grateful. As important as these temporal joys truly are, they are still just pale imitations of eternal ones. In fact, I would suspect that at least some of those lacking the kinds of temporal blessings we take for granted might have more joyful Christmases than many of us who do. Whenever someone understands that it is Jesus Christ who brings joy to the world, and not temporal stuff, it has two effects. First, we are now free to enjoy even the most meager of temporal gifts with an even greater gratitude. Second, we can rejoice even without them, which is why those in true poverty are not those without food, shelter, clothing or toys this Christmas. It is those without Christ's Mass!





GOSPEL MEDITATION

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Tragedy and disappointment are inevitable. What sees you through this? There will be challenges, changes, unexpected circumstances, interrupted plans, hurts, and injustices experienced by every human being at some point in their lives. We will be asked to adjust our plans, change course, and even encounter suffering and death. Where do we learn all of the lessons we need to live life well? Some of them we learn along the way but much of what we bring to life, positive and negative, comes from our early beginnings, our families. This is our early world and provides the blueprint for how we see the bigger, more inclusive world, which unfolds before us.

Our families of origin can be sources of grace, heartache or a combination of both. Families are intended to be pivotal in providing us with proper social structure and understanding, a support system, lessons about relationships and communication, and the unconditional acceptance and love we so desperately crave. They can also determine whether we have an accessible and healthy relationship with God. Many of life's challenges can literally bring us to our knees and require that we possess a strength of character that resides well beyond the superficialities of our world. At some point we will all need three coping gifts that can be given to us only by God: faith, hope, and love. Our families help us learn that we are not the ones responsible for their creation, but God!

Our experience of early family life colors all of our relationships and what we expect to achieve from life in general. Resolving conflicts, dealing with difficulty and suffering, celebrating accomplishments, prioritizing our needs, listening to God's call, understanding relationships, understanding disappointment, learning about the virtues and living a centered focused life are all lessons our families either succeed in teaching or do not. To succeed, as God has designed and ordered our world, is to discover his presence and then trust that Presence. The Holy Family can teach even the most dysfunctional family how to best use God's gifts of faith, hope, and love to find him and do his will. Their simple humble example is always before us, showing us the way, Jesus, Mary and Joseph, pray for us!
