Friends,

At some point during the late winter or early spring of 1987, a young mother was faced with a difficult decision. Doctors had diagnosed the unborn son in her womb with an amoebic infection and told her that he was a risk to her health. The doctor recommended that the child be aborted. Fortunately for the Florida Gators, the parents refused, and, on August 14, 1987, Timothy Richard Tebow was born. Not only did Tim Tebow became the first sophomore ever to win the Heisman Trophy, which is awarded each year to the best player in college football, but he also led the Florida Gators to two national championships. He was the first-round draft pick of the Denver Broncos in the National Football League.

It does make one wonder how many would-be Heisman Trophy winners weren't so fortunate. In fact, did you ever wonder how many of the millions of aborted children since 1973 would have won the Heisman Trophy. Well, the folks at Human Life International did and they have crunched the numbers, with staggering results. Who knows how many of those priests and nuns might have saved marriages, converted sinners or became saints?

This is why saying that abortion should be a choice between a mother and her doctor is utter nonsense! Abortion influences all of us, precisely because it robs us of individuals that God has willed, for whatever reason, to come into existence. In fact, if Sacred Scripture has taught us anything, it is that the life of those children conceived in unusual circumstances (e.g. Isaac, Jacob, Samson, Samuel, John the Baptist, and, of course, Jesus) are particularly important.

Of course, we don't need Scripture to tell us this. All we really need is the example of one of our former presidents. Barrack Obama was conceived out of wedlock to a couple that, instead of aborting him and moving on with their lives, tried briefly to make a go of it and get married. It didn't work and the marriage lasted only two years, leaving young Barrack to bounce from country to country, eventually ending up living with his grandparents in Hawaii. Live the Liturgy Inspiration for the Week



"Repent, and believe in the gospel." Some type of honest and sincere repentance is necessary for any type of authentic growth and maturity. We have to come to the realization, unless we are happy wallowing in immaturity and superficiality, that the way we have been doing things is not the best or the healthiest. There isn't a human being alive who hasn't acted foolishly or erratically at the cost of almost losing a treasured relationship. "Why did I act that way?" is a question we often ponder after some reflection and enlightenment. Faith works the same way. Stumbling through life and bumping up against meaninglessness, a person can begin to see that something significant is missing. They see that there is merit to a relationship with God and an embrace of faith. Before these can take root, sincere sorrow for past wrong doing, missed opportunities, errors in judgment, and short sightedness is necessary. Repentance is necessary. Then having realized that we were walking in darkness, we can rejoice that by God's grace we now see the light.
