Friends,

One of the debates that has plagued the Church throughout Her existence is the relationship between faith and science. At times, these debates have become so contentious that it has led both to persecutions of science by Christians and persecution of Christianity by science.

And this is a shame, precisely because if there were ever two realities that should be closely aligned, it is the realities of faith and science. Think of it this way. God is the author of all truth. Our human experience, however, receives these truths from God in two different, but complementary, ways. One way we receive truth is by discerning it in our world through our senses. This is the process we call "science". The goal of science is determine what is true in our world by analyzing what is observable. Thus, when science has enough information from enough observation, it declares some observable reality to be "true".

Notice, however, that this field of science is limited only to what is observable. There is another entirely different realm of truth authored by God – the unobservable, or what we might think of as the spiritual. We testify to these two realms in the very first line of the Nicene Creed. "We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible." Not only is God the author of the truth that is visible, which is discerned by science, but also of the truth that is invisible. This truth that is invisible is the truth that God reveals to us directly. Of course, we call this truth faith.

When seen in this light, two interesting observations can be made. The first is that there is more certainty in truths of faith than there is with truths of science. It may seem odd to say that we are more certain that God is a Trinity of persons than we are that two plus two equals four, but it is true nonetheless. For while God is the author of all truth, some truths He tells us directly (i.e. faith), other truth He allows us to discover for ourselves (i.e. science). Naturally, those truths God reveals directly are more reliable than those we discern from our limited senses.

Our human experience seems to corroborate this fact as well. In fact, if there is anything that has proven itself more likely to change than the weather it is "truths" science has discerned. For instance, when I was in high school, we learned in science that our world was slipping into another ice age. Today, we are worried about global warming. At one time it was an absolutely indisputable scientific fact that the earth was the center of the universe. Centuries later it was an absolutely indisputable scientific fact that the sun is. Now we know that neither is. At one time it was an absolutely indisputable scientific fact that the world was flat, that an atom was the absolute smallest particle known to man, there are nine planets in our solar system etc... Of course, the list could go on and on and on.

You see, it's not that science is evil and always wrong. In fact, the opposite is true. Science is necessary for us to develop into the creatures God wants us to be. The reason God gave us human intellect is so that we could exercise it and discern Him in the truths we observe in our world. The difficulty comes when we forget that there are really no absolutely indisputable scientific facts. For given enough time and enough new information, what was thought to be true may evolve.

The same thing, however, does not happen with truths of faith. No matter how much time or new information we receive, God will continue to be three persons completely sharing one divine nature. Jesus Christ will always be true God and true man. Mary will always have been assumed to heaven body and soul. These and the numerous other truths of our faith will, unlike science, never change and never evolve. Since they are revealed directly by God Himself, they are the truest realities in our world.

Our second observation is that there can never be any real contradictions to what is revealed to us in faith and what we have discerned as true in science. This is probably self-evident by now. Since God is the author of all truth, and since God cannot contradict Himself, there can be no contradiction in our discernment of God in this world (science) and what God has revealed to us directly (faith). *(Continued on last page)




Of course, there have been, are and will continue to be apparent contradictions between truths of faith and truths of science. But these contradictions are the result of misunderstandings. Either these apparent contradictions result from a misunderstanding of science (more likely the case) or a misunderstanding of faith. More often than not, these misunderstandings involve one of these two avenues to truth overstepping their scope of expertise. For instance, Galileo ran into trouble with the Church, not because of his science (which was later discovered to be incorrect, by the way), but because he used his science to make theological statements. This is why the Church treated Galileo harshly (too harshly, in fact). The Church was harsh with Galileo, not because the science he formulated, but because of the faith conclusions he postulated from the science he formulated.

You see, faith and science are like two lungs, faith and science are meant to work together to discern truth. When one tries to do the job of the other, there is going to be difficulties. It is only when both of these lungs work together and stop trying to do the work of the other that the organism of human will breathe deeply from the truth that is not idea, but a person; the person of Jesus Christ.

Tive the Liturgy Inspiration for the Week



Most of us are not trail blazers. Throughout history though, there have been many folks who tirelessly and persistently pursued the promptings of their hearts without giving any care to what others thought or trends dictated. Jesus is one of them. St. Teresa of Calcutta and St. Francis of Assisi are examples of others. The rest of us are people who take a more measured look at things, want to test the waters, and take our time choosing what path or person to follow. We need credible witnesses of faith. We need the Moses people in our lives to show us by word and deed who God is and what integrity and a purpose-driven life looks like. They are the pointers to truth, who even though they struggle themselves, seem to embody an unspoken timeless wisdom that just sounds and feels right. Jesus taught with this same type of authority and caught the attention of the greatest of skeptics. They were astonished.
