Friends.

I can't tell you how impressed I am with the young adults of our parishes. There are so many young adults far more attuned with their faith than I ever was at their age. In fact, I sometimes wonder if some of them have better relationships with Jesus and His Church than I do now.

However, that doesn't mean our young people are immune from the pressures of society, especially the culture of death that oozes out of sexual immorality. Because young people are so drawn to technology and so proficient with it, ALL of them have been assaulted with impure images, suggestive dialogue, and other vulgarities they might have never encountered without it. It should really be no surprise, then, that many of these wonderful Catholic young men and women fall victim to pornography, masturbation and fornication. The assaults on them by the culture are that profound.

Of all the consequences such behavior can have on the individuals, the most devastating might be the most unrecognized... shame. Shame is sometimes confused with guilt because the feelings arising from them are so similar. However, there is an important difference between the two. Where guilt seeks to right the wrong that was done, shame seeks to hide it.

Shame is particularly problematic with sins against our body. After all, there is nothing more sacred to us than our bodies. No one likes their body evaluated, judged or belittled because our bodies carry a special reverence. As a result, sins against our bodies carry a heightened shame.

This shame is amplified when a person is striving mightily to live their Catholic faith. In fact, the more seriously we want to serve Jesus Christ, the more shame we experience with our failures. It is this shame that tempts us to hide our behavior. And, the greater the shame, the greater the lengths we will go to keep it hidden.

This leads me to a tremendous fear for our young people. I am now entering my twentieth year as a priest. I have taught in Catholic schools my whole priesthood and CCD for high schoolers each year as well. In that time, I'm only aware of one Catholic School student that has ever become pregnant while in high school and that was over 15 years ago. That may sound like a good thing, but it terrifies me. Why?

Well, even though we are blessed with wonderful young adults striving to live out their Catholic faith, they are still under profound assault by our society. There is tremendous pressure on them to engage in illicit sexual activities, and it is inconceivable that all of them withstand this barrage perfectly. Think of it this way, I've prepared dozens, if not hundreds, of couples for marriage. The number who were virgins probably numbers less than 10.

As holy as our young people truly are, they are human and make mistakes with their sexuality. Shouldn't some of these mistakes have led to pregnancy (which, by the way, is NEVER a mistake)? Some may argue "No" because of contraception. I sure hope not. All contraception does is addict a young person to a way of life that not only feeds the culture of death but adds chaos to their own lives in countless, and mostly unnoticed, ways.

Contraception couldn't possibly explain this phenomenon entirely. Not only do all contraceptives fail (more on that another time), but young people are going to be as careful with contraceptives as they are with drinking, wearing life jackets, speeding or other safety measures. So, even with the availability of contraception, it seems to me that there should have been a pregnancy or two in the past fifteen years.

I'm worried that there has been. All hormonal contraceptives (pills, shots, IUDs, etc...) not only prevent ovulation in the woman, but, in the event of breakthrough ovulation, prevent the uterine lining from forming. This means that the fertilized egg (a baby) floating down the fallopian tube has no place to implant. As a result, it is flushed out of the woman during the monthly cycle. That is an abortion. Parents that choose to have the daughters on birth control based on the advice of medical professionals may want to consider this truth. If these young ladies are sexually active, they may be having abortions, whether they know it or not. (\*Continued on Last Page)



After all, if a person is really striving to live their Catholic faith and is faced with a pregnancy, especially in high school, isn't the shame going to tempt such a family to "cover up" this behavior? Would it be inconceivable that someone in great fear and great shame might resort to great lengths to be able to keep that fear hidden?

The great news is that, even if this is the case, there is no sin outside of the scope of God's mercy. What has been done cannot be undone. It can, however, be healed. It can be forgiven. All it takes is the courage to expose the incredible shame to the light of Jesus Christ. Once this is done, the only thing a person caught in such shame will find is a loving God eager to forgive.


