Friends,

There are few things more offensive to us than hypocrisy. Hypocrisy is an abomination and perhaps the best revelation of our human weakness. What I find curious is that this disdain for hypocrisy is not limited to when it is seen in others. In fact, it is better seen in the lengths we will go to disguise the hypocrisy we see in ourselves. As much as we hate to admit it, we are all hypocrites, since our practices never perfectly correspond to our beliefs.

This truth, however, should not frighten us but rather encourage us. It is in our weakness, in our hypocrisy, that we best experience Jesus' love. In fact, love is not love if it is deserved. Love is only love when it is given. And the best way to know that love is truly given is when we know that it can, in no sense, be earned. This is what Jesus proves to us in our hypocrisy. We are loved by Him in something that we despise most about ourselves. The key to winning freedom from our hypocrisy is not eliminating it. That can never be done this side of Heaven. Rather, freedom from hypocrisy comes from letting ourselves be loved in spite of it.

Unfortunately, letting God love us in the tension of our hypocrisy is incredibly difficult. The most common way to resolve the tension of our hypocrisy is by simply changing our beliefs. After all, if our practices don't match our beliefs, it is always easier to simply modify our beliefs to accommodate our behaviors than it is to modify our behaviors to be in line with our beliefs.

All it really takes to do this is the right rationalization, the right compromise of belief by one person, and pretty soon all of society is following that path. We are more like sheep than we often care to admit. Just as sheep move and scatter as a group almost out of reflex, so we too will often escape the pain of our hypocrisy the instant someone or something convinces us that the grass is greener elsewhere.

Unfortunately, we've seen this drama play out over the past century in western cultures around the issue of contraception. In fact, every Christian denomination, not just Catholics, considered the use of contraception immoral prior to 1930. It's probably clear why. The greatest deterrent to the illicit use of the marital act is fear of pregnancy. If you remove this fear, you make it more likely for couples to engage in sex outside of the Sacrament of Marriage. When couples do this, marriage breaks down. When marriage breaks down, the family unit cracks. When the family unit cracks, the morality of a society goes with it, since we learn morality in families.

That would all change after World War II. With the industrialization of society, children became more economically disadvantageous. Additionally, fears of overpopulation stemming from a baby boom seemed to necessitate responsible parenthood. So, one by one, denomination after denomination, in the face of this pressure they changed their position on the use of contraception. What they once held as immoral now was changed to be permitted.

It was thought that the Catholic Church would do so as well. But, in perhaps the best example of the importance of a good shepherd, on July 25, 1968, the pope at that time, a man named Paul VI, wrote a letter called Humanae Vitae. In that letter, the pope reiterated once again the Catholic Church's 2,000-year-old prohibition of the use of artificial contraception, as well as predicting how morality in society would be decimated just as the entire Christian world feared prior to 1930. Now, I don't think I have to work too hard to prove that this prediction has come true in spades. As our families have been blown up since the contraceptive fueled sexual revolution of the 1960s, morality in our society has disappeared right along with it. Why, if the pope predicted it, did no one listen?

There weren't enough true shepherds for the sheep. Instead of following their shepherd, many in the hierarchy of the Church led their flocks astray by either (a) ignoring this teaching, (b) minimizing this truth or (c) contradicting this truth. Is it any wonder that the sheep who wanted to go to these "greener" pastures anxiously followed the "shepherds" leading them astray. As a result, we have a western world that, because its addiction to contraception, is destroying the family and is spiraling down a sewer of debauchery. Had the secondary authorities respected the ultimate authority of the pope, many people, and perhaps even society as whole, might have been saved from this nightmare.

Our only path forward at this point is learning to live in our own hypocrisy. Whether it is contraception, lying, swearing, abortion, gossip, speeding or whatever our pet vice or vices are, the only way we can be liberated by them is by admitting that they are a problem. If we simply rationalize away that they are actually ok or no big deal, we are losing opportunities to experience God's unconditional love for us. However, when we bring them to the Sacrament of Confession, when we do this frequently, when we confess the same things over and over and over again without compromising the evil of the actions, we begin, sometimes slowly, to discover the truth. God doesn't love us because we are good people that do good things for Him. We are good people that do good things for Him because He loves us.




