Friends,

Anyone that has ever been on a diet can tell you that occasional falls are part of the experience. Whether it is the donuts a co-worker brought to work or the ice cream that just cries out to be smothered in chocolate sauce, a periodic indulgence often threatens to scuttle even the strictest of dieters.

Such indulgences, however, are not limited to items of food. In fact, the Church not only permits the occasional indulgence, but encourages them as well. But, this might not happen quite the way that we think. The Church's understanding of indulgences arises from certain truths about Jesus Christ. For instance, since Jesus Christ was God, the sacrifice He offered for the salvation of our souls carried an infinite value. Since a sacrifice of infinite value can never be completely exhausted, this means that Jesus did more than He needed to pay back the debt that humanity owed to God because of our sins.

If Jesus paid back to God more than what was owed by the human race, where's our refund? That is precisely what an indulgence is. An indulgence is God's payment to us of some of the excess merits won on behalf of the human race by Jesus Christ for the performance of some good work that the Church wants to reward. You see, with His Ascension, Jesus bequeathed to His Church the remainder of the merits He had won for her by His passion. The Church, then, is to safeguard and distribute these merits as she sees fit.

One of the ways the Church distributes these excess merits won for us by Jesus Christ is by granting an indulgence. It works this way. Every time we commit a sin, there is a debt that is incurred. We owe both God and humanity something for making ourselves lesser people through our sinful behavior. Naturally, this debt must be repaid before we can ever enter heaven.

Of course, the most familiar way this debt is repaid is by doing our assigned penance after the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Our penance, however, may only repay part of the debt owed by our sins, even though all of our sins are forgiven. Any remaining debt must still be repaid before we can enter our eternal reward. One of the ways this can happen is by obtaining an indulgence. You see, the Church has assigned indulgences to certain actions that it wants to encourage. As a result, if a particular action is completed, the Church, in addition to the benefits of the good work itself, adds an indulgence, much like a kind mother might add chocolate sauce on top of vanilla ice cream.

This is the best part. The Church has never abrogated the practice of obtaining indulgences. In fact, we can still receive indulgences in our day! Even doing simple things such as reading the bible, attending Eucharistic Adoration and praying the rosary can all be rewarded with indulgences from the Church (see <http://www.ourladyswarriors.org/indulge/plenary.htm> for a good list).

This indulgence, or any other indulgence, becomes full or plenary if Holy Communion is received, the Sacrament of Confession is received within eight days of the designated action, prayers for the Holy Father's intention are recited and attachment to all sin is removed. Otherwise, the indulgence is partial, meaning only part of the debt we owe for our sins is removed.

Think about what this means! In addition to the spiritual benefits gained from performing such pious works, during this next year, all of us have the opportunity to pay back all of the debt that is owed for our sins. Should we die in such a state, we bypass purgatory completely and go straight to heaven!! Best of all, we gain this indulgence for a deceased loved one as well! Additionally, there is also no limit to the number of indulgences that can be gained, since there is no limit to the merits won by Jesus Christ. So why not take advantage of this opportunity and indulge in a little chocolate sauce on your spiritual ice cream? After all, you and your loved ones deserve it!

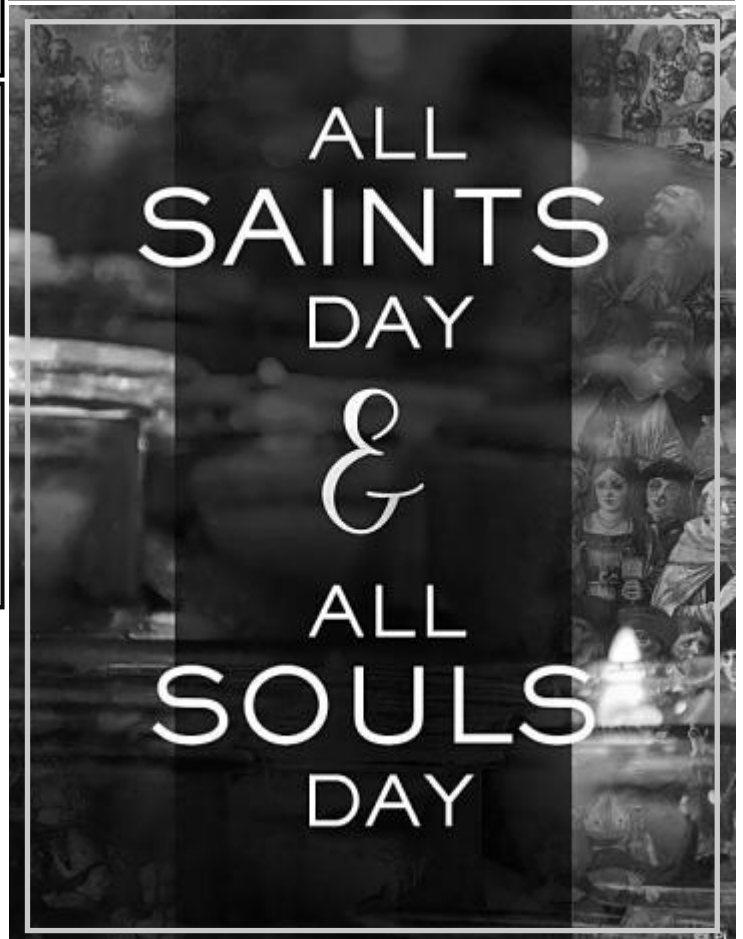
