Friends,

When I was a kid, having company over for the holidays, or any other time for that matter, was always something of a mixed blessing. On the one hand, company provided a welcome distraction from having to deal exclusively with my brothers and sisters. On the other hand, company also meant a lot of work. My parents usually tolerated a certain level of messiness in the house when we were alone. However, company meant that our house must be cleaned thoroughly.

Seen in this light, the season of Advent might take on a deeper meaning. During Advent, the Church is called to prepare its house for the arrival of Jesus Christ. Just like the anticipated arrival of a special dignitary would necessitate a special level of preparation for our home, so, too, the anticipated arrival of Jesus Christ demands, not simply some cursory level of preparation of the Church, but rather a level of preparation that is worthy of such an esteemed guest.

Part of this cleaning is obvious. The church, as the Lord's house, will be decorated in a way that draws our attention to the coming of the Guest. But, there is another house that also must be prepared for the coming of Jesus Christ. That house is our body. Not only does St. Paul call our body a temple, the temple of the Holy Spirit, but also Jesus, when He is making His final journey to Jerusalem, challenges the Jews that if they destroy this temple, He will rebuild it in three days. Of course, the temple to which He was referring was not one made of mortar and brick. No. The temple Jesus refers to is His body.

This temple, this house, must also be prepared for the arrival of our supreme company. Sometimes, however, it seems to me that our attitude toward cleaning this temple of the Holy Spirit is similar to my attitude when told by my parents to clean my room because we had company coming. Any clothes on the floor would be stuffed into the closet or under the bed. The vacuum cleaner would be turned on, but never pushed. Any garbage would not be taken out and disposed of properly, but rather hidden in some secret place until its stench became potent enough to lead to its discovery.

Yet, how many of us have similar attitudes to our Advent call to prepare our house. Recognize that we receive this guest, not simply at Christmas but also each and every time we attend Mass or receive Holy Communion. Yet how many times have we received this greatest of all guests in hands that have been dirtied, not by the soil of hard work, but by the filthiness of sin? How many times have we received this guest into mouths that are soiled by foul language, gossip, slander, detraction, lies or even sexual indiscretion?

During this Advent season we are called in a special way to clean this house of the ugliness of sin so that it might be a nicer place for this most special guest to visit. Of course, this cleansing is done most appropriately in the sacrament of confession. Sometimes, however, I get the impression that we think that God is as gullible as my parents were when inspecting the part of our house that I was supposed to clean. We think that if we hide certain sins from the priest by stuffing them in the closet, sweeping them under the rug, or hiding them under the bed, we will trick him into thinking our room is clean. Unfortunately, this will appear to work because the priest cannot see what is hidden. But God, who sees in secret, will not only see the dirtiness we work so hard to hide, but will also be saddened by our thinking Him to be such a fool.

During Advent it is so important, not simply to go to confession, but also to make a good confession. This is done by examining our conscience for every speck of dirt we can find and begging God for the courage to trust Him enough to bring this dirt before His priest. Unlike human beings that are so often repulsed by the dirtiness of sin, God is not. Rather, He embraces it, knowing that He cannot only eradicate the darkness of sin, but leave in its place a truly clean house; a house worthy of receiving His Son.
