Friends,

I'll never forget the day Mother Theresa died. In the middle of a seminary soccer game, the church bell began to ring signaling that all of us were called to the chapel. Before too long, the word had spread as to why-Mother Theresa had died. Being an eager seminarian, I rushed to the chapel to lend my spiritual support, but to be honest, I didn't quite understand why. After all, if there were ever a person more clearly a saint than Mother Theresa, I don't know who it would be. Since saints don't need our prayers, I wondered why we were "wasting" our time praying for someone that was so certain to be in heaven already.

As I was praying, however, an answer came to me. Even someone as holy as Mother Theresa did not deserve heaven. No matter how many good works she performed, they were still not enough to make up for even a portion of her smallest venial sins. After all, any sin committed against Almighty God incurs an infinite debt owed. No finite creature can pay an infinite debt. Thus, even someone as profoundly holy as Mother Theresa does not "earn" her way to heaven. Like the rest of us, she is completely dependent on the mercy of God.

With the passing of years, we now know that the prayers offered for the repose of the soul of Mother Theresa were not needed. With her canonization, the Church has proclaimed that Mother Theresa is a saint. Does that mean that those prayers offered for her were wasted? Of course not! From heaven, Mother Theresa could direct those prayers offered for her to those who had most need of them.

It works the same for our beloved dead. All of them, regardless of the good they have done, are dependent on the Lord of His mercy. Thus, it is disadvantageous to assume they are in heaven immediately. After all, if they are in purgatory, they are indeed suffering greatly, although their suffering might be a little different than what we think.

Maybe think about the pain in purgatory this way. There is no more "painful" experience for a small child than counting down the days to Christmas. They are so excited about the joy that is coming that they can hardly contain themselves. Of course, counting down the time only makes the process more agonizing since the more you watch the clock, the slower the clock appears to move.

Something similar happens in purgatory, only the "pain" of waiting is magnified about a b'jillion times! After all, the gift that we are waiting in purgatory for is nothing less than God Himself. Since He is infinitely more joyful than any Christmas gift, the "pain" of waiting for Him is infinitely more intense as well. Compounding this "pain" is the realization that, if we had only done what we should have in this life, we would be enjoying the gift of God right now. But, since we did not, we must wait!

Compounding this "pain" if only slightly is the fact that the soul waiting in Purgatory can do nothing to shorten this time. Having already run his race on earth, he is now consigned to wait for the help of others to bring him to his completion. One of the vehicles that can help bring him to his destination is our prayers. It is also the most familiar.

Perhaps now we see why the Church so emphasizes the importance of praying for the dead, especially in November. It is also why it is so important for us to have the prayer of the Mass offered for our deceased loved ones, regardless of their holiness. After all, like Mother Theresa, our beloved dead are still dependent on God's mercy, and our prayers for them are not wasted regardless even if they are already with God in Heaven.


