Friends,

Whenever I visit one of my sisters in Omaha, I'm always amazed at the effort that folks in her subdivision put into taking care of their lawn. Not only is equipment like lawn mowers, weed eaters, edgers, trimmers and even fertilizers all quite expensive to buy and time consuming to use or apply, but the amount of water used to keep these lawns green is astonishing. Of course, God forbid that weeds, crabgrass or dandelions would ever make their appearance in such a sacred place. If they did, these homeowners would go to extreme lengths to rid their lawns of such a menace, and do it almost immediately. And, to be honest, I just don't get it. I mean, even if a lawn is riddled with weeds and dandelions, once it is mowed, it still looks reasonably good. Does so much effort really need to be made to keep lawns looking nice?

Of course, homeowners in such subdivisions would argue that it is. After all, if they just mow the dandelions and weeds away, the problem isn't really solved. Almost immediately, the dandelions and weeds will spring up again, and, once they do, they will spread to more and more parts of the lawn. In order to protect the entire lawn from becoming destroyed, they argue, such weeds and dandelions must be rooted out completely and immediately. Even something as benign as one dandelion can threaten the health of the entire lawn.

I sometimes wonder, however, what the world would be like if we cared for our souls as meticulously as these homeowners care for their lawns. There are some parallels between the care of a lawn and the care of our souls. One such parallel is how to deal with weeds. For our soul, these weeds are called sin, and the way we rid our soul of these weeds is by using the sacrament of confession.

I sometimes wonder, however, how often we use the sacrament of confession simply to mow these weeds without ever attempting to get at their root. Perhaps this is part of the reason why we confess so many of the same things over and over and over again. Instead of eradicating the root, we are merely cutting off the top of the dandelions.

This is not a bad thing. Just as it does make a lawn look better, if only for awhile, if we cut the heads off of those dandelions, so, too, our souls will look better with the heads of our sins cut off. But, sooner rather than later, since the root is still there, they will grow back again, leaving the lawn of our soul unkempt.

So how do we get to the root? Well, for starters, we need to re-evaluate how we make a good confession. After all, most of us learned everything we know about examining our conscience in the second grade. This information was both foundational and basic. We were taught to think of the Ten Commandments and list all the sins we could remember committing. This is both a beautiful and indispensable aspect of the Sacrament of Confession. However, it is also basic. It teaches us to "mow" the dandelions of our soul, but makes no provision for rooting them out.

If we really want to rid ourselves of the dandelions that may have taken root in our soul, we have to go a little deeper. To do this, we must reexamine how we examine our conscience. It is still necessary to incorporate all the elements we learned in the second grade. However, we also want to look deeper.

One of the ways we can do that is with something St. Ignatius of Loyola called the daily examen. At the end of the day, we go back and look at every aspect of that day; from the thoughts that entered your mind as you woke up to the encounters you had with others during the day; from the way you noticed the trees while driving to the time spent on the phone. As we go through every experience in detail, St. Ignatius tells us to discover what God was saying to you in each moment. God is in all of them and is speaking to us as well. Find out what graces He offered, which we took advantage of and which we did not. By spending even as little as five minutes a night doing this, we can gain new insights into, not simply the ways we did or did not respond to God, but also look at the reasons why. Discovering the reason why is really the key to uprooting the dandelions of sin that inhabit the lawn of our soul.

WHEN JESUS SAYS, "YOU **CANNOT SERVE BOTH GOD AND** MAMMON." WHAT DOES HE MEAN? WHAT IS MAMMON?

When you hear Scripture proclaimed each Sunday, remember it wasn't originally written in English. Hebrew, Aramaic, Greek — these ancient tongues were the original language of our Old and New Testaments. Most of the time, all of the words are translated into our native language. Sometimes, a word or two is left in the original language. Such is the case in this Scripture passage.

Mammon is an ancient Aramaic word referring to money, wealth, or profit. Earthly wealth isn't bad in itself, nor does it automatically exclude us from being a disciple of Jesus. But what dominates our life? To serve money — that is, to seek accumulation of wealth for its own sake and to structure our lives around it — is morally problematic. What good is our wealth if it isn't at the service of others? What good is our wealth if its pursuit leads us to selfishness, obsession, greed, envy, and comparison? There are many things that can be opposed to our service of God — power, prestige, popularity. Ultimately, something in our lives will be our master. But there is only one God worth serving.
