Friends,

On Monday, April 25, representatives from all four of the parishes in our cluster, including Fr. Steve and myself, met with others representatives from our deanery with the Archbishop and his pastoral planning team. The meeting was sobering.

There are three unassailable realities that will necessitate changes in the structure of parish life in our archdiocese. The first is the decline in Mass attendance. Since 1955, the Mass attendance has dropped precipitously. Almost three quarters of Catholics were attending Mass in 1955, but only about one quarter attend today. Second, the demographics of the archdiocese has shifted and diversified. There are fewer Catholics in the fourteen most rural counties of the archdiocese now than there were in 1890. Those rural counties that have grown have done so largely because of an increase in the Hispanic population. Finally, the number of active priests is decreasing from 105 currently to a projected 84 by 2033 (and that is a generous estimate in my opinion). Since the archdiocese is coming to the end of the five-year cluster experiment, the archbishop wants to begin a new, ten-year restructuring plan to address these realities.

The archdiocese has released a new organizational structure as a way of beginning this process. Beginning July 1, 2023, our four parishes will join with Ss. Cyril and Methodius in Clarkson to form what is being called a parish family. There will still be two priests to serve the five parishes in this new family.

The challenge will be the organization and governance of these new families. A group of representatives from each parish in the new family will meet to work on a proposal to submit to the archbishop. This will involve some very difficult conversations, from the revisiting of the Mass schedule to the centralization of administration and resources, including finances, to the future of our Catholic schools. The archbishop will have to sign off on these proposals.

Recently, the chancellor of the Archdiocese was quoted (accurately) in the Humphrey Democrat as saying that discussions of closing or consolidating parishes or schools was taken off the table. "The idea right now is that parishes would stay open. It could be that one of these parish families could make that suggestion (to close a parish) if they wanted to. Other than taking a look at putting parishes in the families, a lot of the decision making will be left up to the parish families."

This is a confused and easily misunderstood statement. The archdiocese has mandated certain governance models for both parishes and schools. While the parish family gets to pick one, none of them would be models the parish family would choose or design willingly. I'll give an example that does NOT apply to our family. Under the governance rules mandated by the archdiocese, priests are only allowed to say either four Masses in two parishes or three Masses in three parishes on a weekend. If a parish family had more than six churches (which ours doesn't but many do) there could be no more than six of them with a weekend Mass. The remaining would not have Masses on the weekend, period. They could choose to stay open for baptisms, weddings, PRE and the like. But, there would be no weekend Masses said at that church. Of course, like the chancellor implied, the family could decide to close the Church, but it is essentially a decision pressed upon it by the archdiocese.

While we don't have that difficulty in our cluster, we will face even more challenging difficulties with regard to our Catholic schools. The governance models for schools do not anticipate our particular situation with two high schools in one family. I have asked if the models proposed for school governance are exhaustive or capable of adjustment and, to date, have received no clear answer. The only clarity I have is that our hands will be tied regarding some of the most important decisions involving both parishes and schools. (Continued on last page.)*






