Friends,

If there is one experience that I know plenty about, it is the feeling of confusion. Thus, I can definitely relate to the experience of St. Peter after the resurrection. Not only has St. Peter witnessed the senseless crucifixion of the man he knew to be the Christ, God's anointed one, but also, three days later, this same man begins appearing to His followers in different places and in different ways. Quite frankly, all of this has St. Peter at the end of his rope. In order to clear his mind, he returns to the one thing that he knows best; fishing.

Or at least it's the thing he thought he knew best. You see, when St. Peter and his colleagues return to the water, they seem to have lost their touch. Despite spending the whole night at sea, these professional fishermen greet the rising sun much like I do when I go fishing; tired, frustrated and skunked.

Imagine their mood, then, when some know-it-all on the shore starts offering his advice. "Hey, throw your nets over the other side of the boat". Of course, if it had been me on the boat, the only thing that would have been thrown over the other side was the remains of the soon-to-be deceased stranger. Because of their humility, the disciples are rewarded with a catch so large that the weight threatens to capsize both of their boats.

But the important thing is what happens next. Recognizing the miraculous even when it is disguised in the presence of the natural, St. John cries out, "It is the Lord." In a move Forrest Gump would emulate two millennia later, St. Peter leaps off his fishing boat and swims to shore to be with the Lord. His exuberance is so childlike that it knows no restraints.

It is St. Peter's childlike exuberance that is going to be the key to his salvation. Like any little child, St. Peter doesn't take himself too seriously. When he makes a mistake, he doesn't keep beating himself up. Rather, he admits his mistake and moves on.

In fact, it is this childlikeness that helps St. Peter avoid the fate chosen by Judas Iscariot. Both betrayed Jesus by their denial. Only one was proud enough to believe the lie that they could never commit such a grave sin. It is believing this lie that eventually leads Judas down the path to suicide. Judas thinks himself incapable of so great a sin, when he does commit it, he also thinks himself unworthy of forgiveness. For he, above all people, should have known better. Notice the subtly of pride! It is this pride that increases Judas' shame by constantly reminding him that he should have known better, until eventually Judas' shame reaches a point to where even suicide seems like a better option than living with it.

But why doesn't this same thing happen to St. Peter? One might argue that St. Peter was three times guiltier than Judas because, while Judas only betrayed Jesus once, St. Peter did it three times. The answer is St. Peter's childlikeness. Rather than thinking himself incapable of such a sin, St. Peter understands how weak he is. It is this humility that leads St. Peter to forgiveness. This is the essence of what being a little child is all about. For at its heart, being child-like is not so much about innocence. At its heart, being child-like is about dependence.

This is a lesson Jesus teaches St. Peter after St. Peter's three-fold affirmation of love undoes his three-fold denial. Notice carefully what Jesus says. "When you were younger, you used to dress yourself and go where you wanted; but when you grow old, you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will dress you and lead you where you do not want to go." 



These words must have brought clarity to St. Peter's confusion. When he was young, St. Peter was willing to follow Jesus, but only on his own terms. This is why St. Peter drew his sword and cut off the ear of the high priest's slave. As long as he could go down on his own terms and in his own way, St. Peter was perfectly willing to die for Jesus. But, this is childishness, not child-likeness. Childishness demands to do whatever it wants whenever it wants. Child-likeness submits to the Lord, is dependent on the Lord in every situation and in every way. This is the lesson Jesus is teaching. If we really want to be Jesus' disciples, we must reject the childish independence expressed by St. Peter's pride and embrace the child-like dependence expressed by St. Peter's humility.

This is hard. Our world measures maturity not on the dependence of humility, but rather on the independence of pride. It is exactly the opposite with God. God measures maturity on how dependent on Him we have become. If we truly want to become better followers of Jesus, we must shed this so-called maturity of the world in favor of a more and more complete dependence on God. It is only through our dependence that we can become like little children, which is why Jesus says the kingdom of heaven belongs to ones such as these.
