Friends,

One of the characteristics that distinguishes the Catholic Church from other Christian denominations is our understanding of the saints. While other Christian denominations would certainly recognize the reality of saints, only Catholics realize they remain intimately united with us. In fact, saints are really our older brothers and sisters that already won the race we are running and now wait at the finish line, cheering us on.

One of the ways we thank them for their encouragement is by celebrating that they received His eternal reward – the day of their death. You see, much like the greatest athletes of professional sports celebrate annually the day they entered their hall of fame, so too the Church annually celebrates the day one of her own, the saint, entered the ultimate Hall of Fame – the kingdom of heaven.

There are, however, three notable exceptions to this general rule. Two are perhaps obvious because we not only celebrate their birthdays, but also the days of their conception as well. Jesus, whose birth we celebrate at Christmas, is also celebrated at His conception nine months earlier with the feast of the Annunciation. Mary, whose birthday we celebrate on September 8, is also celebrated nine months "earlier" on December 8, with the feast of the Immaculate Conception.

The third saint whose birthday we celebrate is St. John the Baptist. Unlike Jesus and Mary, however, St. John the Baptist was not conceived a saint. Like all of us, John the Baptist was conceived with Original Sin. Yet, since the Church celebrates his birth with a feast day, we know that he was born a saint.

Precisely when did this transformation occur? Well, think for a moment about the events surrounding Jesus' birth. After the Angel Gabriel visited Mary, she immediately went to visit her cousin Elizabeth, who was also pregnant at the time with St. John the Baptist. Do you remember what happened when these two pregnant women met? According to the gospel of St. Luke, Elizabeth said to Mary, "The moment your greeting hit my ear, the child in my womb leapt for joy." This is the moment the Church tells us that John becomes a saint, which is why he leaps for joy. Having been "baptized" by Jesus in the womb of his mother, John the Baptist was born a saint.

Believe it or not, this little verse has tremendous ramifications for our society today. Think about what is happening. There is communication between two pre-born children. Only life that is already human is worthy, not simply of being sanctified as St. John the Baptist was, but also of being honored and celebrated as saints, as the Church does with Jesus and Mary. This is part of the reason why the Church has always taught that human life begins at conception. Of course, science confirms this truth.

Yet, if both faith and science confirm that life begins at conception, how could any rational person, but especially those claiming to share our Catholic faith, support its destruction. Yet since the anniversary of Roe v Wade in 1973, over 60 million pre-born children have been destroyed by surgical abortion, and with the support of many professing the Catholic faith.

Unfortunately, it gets even worse. With abortion as an established norm, the attack on human life has expanded to the harvesting of embryonic stem cells. This process can only be compared to the cannibalization of one class of human beings so that we might use their parts in order to fix another class of human beings. Clearly no moral person could support the use of one class of people as spare parts for another class of people. Yet, if we truly believe what God is telling us through our Catholic faith, this is precisely what is happening through the process of embryonic stem cell research. For the only differences between embryos and us are cosmetic. They are younger and look differently than we do.

Compounding this phenomenon is the acceptance of fertilization methods that result in the creation of multiple embryos so that the best, most viable one may be implanted in the mother. I wonder what becomes of this "lucky" child's brothers and sisters that were left behind in a cryogenic hell?

What is our reaction? Do we buy into the rationalizations that these embryos, these tiny masses of cells that our faith tells us are human beings, are disposable since they are going to be destroyed anyway? Or, do we believe the faith we claim to profess, by standing up for those who are defenseless, those who are voiceless, those who are condemned, and those who are really our least brothers and sisters. I pray that more people will do the latter, since, as Jesus says in the gospel of Matthew, "whatever you do for these least brothers of mine, you do for Me."




