Friends.

Whenever I visit one of my sisters in Omaha, I'm always amazed at the effort that folks in her subdivision put into taking care of their lawn. Not only is equipment like lawn mowers, weed eaters, edgers, trimmers and even fertilizers all quite expensive to buy and time consuming to use or apply, but the amount of water used to keep these lawns green is astonishing. Of course, God forbid that weeds, crabgrass or dandelions would ever make their appearance in such a sacred place. If they did, these homeowners would go to extreme lengths to rid their lawns of such a menace, and do it almost immediately. Is it worth it?

Homeowners would argue that it is. If they just mow the dandelions and weeds away, the problem isn't really solved. Almost immediately, the dandelions and weeds will spring up again, and, once they do, they will spread to more and more parts of the lawn. Even one dandelion can threaten the health of the entire lawn.

I sometimes wonder, however, what the world would be like if we cared for our souls as meticulously as these homeowners care for their lawns. There are some parallels between the care of a lawn and the care of our souls. For our soul, these weeds are called sin, and the way we eradicate them is by using the sacrament of confession.

How often we use the sacrament of confession simply to mow these weeds without ever attempting to get at their root. Perhaps this is part of the reason why we confess so many of the same things over and over again. Instead of eradicating the root, we are merely cutting off the top of the dandelions.

So how do we get to the root? Well, for starters, we need to re-evaluate how we make a good confession. After all, most of us learned everything we know about examining our conscience and making a good confession in the second grade. We were taught to list all the sins we committed that we could remember and that the way we knew they were sins is if they violated the Ten Commandments. Recognize that this is both beautiful and indispensable as well as basic. It teaches us to "mow" the dandelions of our soul, but makes no provision for rooting them out.

If we really want to rid ourselves of the dandelions that may have taken root in our soul, we have to go a little deeper. We must reexamine how we examine our conscience. One of the ways we can do that is with something St. Ignatius of Loyola called the daily examen.

What St. Ignatius recommended was, at the end of the day, going back and looking at every aspect of that day; from the thoughts that entered your mind as you woke up to the encounters you had with others during the day; from the way you noticed the trees while driving to the time spent on the phone. As we go through every experience in detail, St. Ignatius tells us to discover what God was saying to you in each moment. God, he says, is indeed there in all of them and is speaking to us as well. Find out what graces He offered, which we took advantage of, and which we did not. By spending even as little as five minutes a night doing this, we can gain new insights into, not simply the ways we did or did not respond to God, but also look at the reasons why.

Discovering these reason why is really the key to uprooting the dandelions of sin that inhabit the lawn of our soul. Perhaps an example will help. Say I tell a lie. Very often, this will get confessed in the sacrament of confession as lying, a violation of the 8th commandment. This is true and beautiful, but incomplete. After all, the reason I told the lie and who I lied to give me insight into the reason for my lie. For instance, I may have lied to obtain something I wanted (greed). Or, I may have lied to protect my reputation (pride). Or, I may have lied to protect someone (false compassion). The reason for the sin reveals the root that needs to be healed in order for the dandelion (lying) to be removed. By looking more closely at the sin and the reason for it, we can discover, with God's grace, not simply the root, but also the "herbicide" that will kill that root and prevent it from appearing



Saint of the Week

Saint Luke, sometimes called The Evangelist, is the author of the third Gospel and the Acts of the Apostles and a physician. There is some debate about how he came to Christianity, though many believe he was a gentile convert. Tradition holds him to be a native of Antioch, Syria, possibly a slave. Most of what we know of Luke comes from Scripture, he was an eloquent and proficient writer, penning with accuracy the events he recounted. He is viewed as one of the best historical sources of the time.

Luke was a close companion of Paul's, joining him at Troas about year 51 and going with him to Macedonia and Philippi. Their paths diverged and met again as they journeyed to spread the Good News. Luke remained with Paul until the latter was martyred in Rome. Saint Luke's Gospel is viewed as one of social justice, giving special attention to the poor. He also emphasizes gentiles hearing the message of Christ. It is the only Gospel with Mary's Magnificat, and spends the most time illuminating the lives of the other women around Jesus.

Accounts of Luke's death are conflicting, some say he was martyred shortly after Paul others that he lived a long life completing his Gospel in Greece and dying at 84. He is the patron saint of physicians.


