Friends,

One of the characteristics that distinguishes the Catholic Church from other Christian denominations is our understanding of the saints. While other Christian denominations would certainly acknowledge not only the presence of saints, but also their legacy of spending all eternity with God in Heaven, only Catholics see these saints as intimately united with those of us still on this earth, working out our salvations "in fear and trembling." In fact, for Catholics the saints are really our older brothers and sisters who, having already won the race we are currently running, wait at the finish line, cheering us on with all their might so that we might share their victory.

One of the many ways we thank them for their encouragement is by celebrating the day a particular saint received his eternal reward. You see, much like the greatest athletes of professional sports celebrate annually the day they entered their hall of fame, usually by recognizing new members, so too the Church annually celebrates the day one of her own, the saint, entered the ultimate Hall of Fame – the Kingdom of Heaven. This is why the Church tries to choose the day of the saint's death to be the feast day for that particular saint. That is the day the saint was inducted into this greatest of all halls of fame.

There are, however, three notable exceptions to this general rule. Two are perhaps obvious, because they were also conceived without any stain of sin, which is why we not only celebrate their birthdays, but also the days of their conception as well. Jesus, whose birth we celebrate at Christmas, is also celebrated at His conception nine months earlier with the feast of the Annunciation. Mary, whose birthday we celebrate on September 8, is also celebrated nine months "earlier" on December 8, with the feast of the Immaculate Conception.

The third saint whose birthday is celebrated by the Church is St. John the Baptist. Unlike Jesus and Mary, however, St. John the Baptist was not conceived a saint. Like all of us John the Baptist was conceived with Original Sin. Yet, since the Church celebrates his birth with a feast day, we know that he was born a saint. And so, at some time between John's conception and his birth, John the Baptist had his Original Sin washed away.

Precisely when did this "baptism" occur? Well, think for a moment about the events surrounding Jesus' birth. Recall how after the Angel Gabriel visited Mary she immediately went to visit her cousin Elizabeth, who was also pregnant at the time with St. John the Baptist. Do you remember what happened when these two pregnant women met? According to the gospel of St. Luke, Elizabeth said to Mary, "The moment your greeting hit my ear, the child in my womb leapt for joy." This is the moment the Church tells us that John becomes a saint, which is why he leaps for joy. And this is also why we celebrate his birth. For having been sanctified by Jesus in the womb of his mother, John the Baptist was born a saint.

Believe it or not, this little verse has tremendous ramifications for our society today. For think about what is happening. There is communication, if only on a supernatural level, between two pre-born children. One is sanctifying while the other is being sanctified. If this is the case, then what is our faith telling us about the beginnings of human life? Clearly, our faith tells us that life begins at the moment of conception. For only life that is already human is worthy, not simply of being sanctified as St. John the Baptist was, but also of being honored and celebrated as saints, as the Church does with Jesus and

If our faith tells us that life begins at conception, and it definitely does, then how could any person claiming to have faith destroy, or even support those who seek to destroy, that most precious gift of life that God gives us? Yet since the anniversary of Roe v Wade in 1973, over 57 million pre-born children have been destroyed by surgical abortion, with the support of many professing the Catholic faith. 

(continued from page 1) Unfortunately, it gets even worse. For now there is increasing pressure to destroy what our faith tells us is human life, by the harvesting of embryonic stem cells. If we have faith, this process can only be compared to the cannibalization of one class of human beings so that we might use their parts in the hope that it will fix another class of human beings that are breaking down through illness. Clearly no moral person could support the use of one class of people being used for spare parts for another class of people. And yet, if we truly believe what God is telling us through our Catholic faith, this is precisely what is happening through the process of embryonic stem cell research. For the only differences between embryos and us are cosmetic. They are younger and look different than we do.

What is our reaction? Do we buy into the rationalizations that these embryos, these tiny masses of cells that our faith tells us are human beings, are disposable since they are going to be destroyed anyway? Or, do we believe the faith we claim to profess, by standing up for those who are defenseless, those who are voiceless, those who are condemned, and those who are really our least brothers in sisters? I sure pray that more people will do the latter, since, as Jesus says in the gospel of Matthew, "whatever you do for these least brothers of mine, you do for me."
