Friends,

Competition is kind of a strange thing. On the one hand, competition is extremely beneficial. For without competition, the talents of a Michelangelo, a Mozart or even a Tiger Woods would never have the chance to develop so profoundly. However, on the other hand, this very same competition can become extremely destructive. For not only can competition tempt people to lie, to cheat or to steal in order to gain an advantage, but also, when it is used not as a motivation for developing talents and skills, but as an excuse to denigrate another, competition becomes evil. Of course, there is one arena in which competition is always destructive -- the spiritual life.

This reality is demonstrated quite profoundly throughout the gospels, but particularly in the story about the widow who contributes two coins to the temple treasury. Quite naturally, the disciples observing this ritual marvel at the many large amounts being donated by the wealthy. But that's not what Jesus marvels at. Ignoring the huge sums of money donated by the wealthy, Jesus notices a poor widow who contributes two small coins worth only a few measly pennies. Yet, since Jesus can read the secrets of the human heart, He knows that this mere pittance is really the greatest of the gifts given. For while others have given far greater sums of money, they only gave from their excess. This poor widow, however, gave so much more. She gave from her need.

Think about what a great act of faith this is! For how hard would it be to give everything, and I mean everything, to Jesus, holding nothing in reserve? Well if you're anything like me that would be terrifying. For instead of controlling your surroundings, you would become absolutely dependent on them.

Yet it is here, in her dependence, that this poor widow's act of faith shines the brightest. For recall what else Jesus says in the gospel. "Unless you become like a little child," Jesus says, "you cannot enter the kingdom of heaven." You see, the child Jesus wants us to become is not merely one who is innocent or pure. No. The most important child-like quality Jesus wants us to possess is dependence. For just as the little child is totally dependent on his parents for everything, so too are we called to be totally dependent on God. This is precisely what this poor widow does with her magnanimous contribution.

Unfortunately, our competitive world would never be able to see this tremendous act of faith. Rather, looking pragmatically at the bottom line, we would only see the huge sums given by others and notice them, perhaps remembering them with plaques or ceremonies or by putting their names on buildings. Of course, that's all well and good. But here's where the danger of spiritual competition rears its ugly head. For to say that one gift is bigger than another, while easily quantifiable by the wisdom of the world, is impossible for us to determine spiritually. For only God can see the secrets of the heart.

Yet, simply think about how often we compare ourselves to others in this way, or in other spiritual matters. Well, at least I'm not like so and so that doesn't come to Mass, or comes to Mass late or leaves Mass early. Or, at least I'm not like so and so who gossips all the time, or whose kids get into trouble, or uses foul language. Or, at least I'm not like so and so who drinks, or who is in an invalid marriage, or runs around. In these and any other number of other cases, the comparisons that arise from our competition with others destroys us.

Here's how. First of all, these comparisons tempt us into a false sense of security about our own lives. After all, we might muse, "If I am ahead of so many other people spiritually, than I am sure to go to heaven." Hogwash! God does not grade on the curve. Rather, He wants us, like the widow in today's gospel to give not from our excess, but from our need. How many of us can say that? Additionally, how many of us can really say that we pray enough? How many of us can say we have no vices to work on? Rather than focusing on the shortcomings of others, wouldn't we be far better served to focus on the shortcomings of our own? This is why one of my favorite prayers has become to ask God to see my own weakness and hypocrisy as well as I am able see it in others. (Continued on last page.)

(Continued from Page 1) Secondly, and perhaps even more importantly, how do we know what the shortcomings of others really are? It could very well be that the persons who struggles with attending Mass, troubled kids, bad language, addictions to alcohol was only given a mere fraction of the blessings we have been given by God. But, like the widow in gospel, they are making the absolute most of them. Thus, even though they are seemingly less productive, they are spiritually very far advanced. For they, just like the poor widow, simply don't have very much to give.

The bottom line is this. Most of us simply have very little idea how God is working in our own lives, let alone how God is working in the lives of others. As a result, competition in the spiritual life is inherently destructive. So the next time we find ourselves comparing ourselves to others or making judgments about them, or even worrying about them, simply take a step back to realize the futility of these actions. Then say a prayer, asking God to be able to see our own weaknesses as well as we see the weaknesses of others.

FROM THE DESK OF FR. OLSEN

In the next few weeks/months decisions will be coming concerning the future of Catholic schools in our new family. The process of announcing these decisions will be as follows:

- 3. The next steps will happen as simultaneously as possible:
 - a. Principals will announce the decision to staffs.
 - b. Emails will be sent to leadership boards about the decision.
 - c. The decision will be posted on all parish websites.
 - d. Prayer chains and text communications will reach out to request people check their parish's website.

As of this weekend, no decisions about our schools have been made. The first test of this system will be a Frequently Asked Questions page that will be posted and updated regularly. The parish websites are the only source for accurate information.

Please continue to pray for our parishes and schools during this time of transition.
