### Friends,

It's always fascinating to me how the genre of science fiction can be used to address some of the most enduring philosophical and ethical questions surrounding human nature. In fact, one of the addictive features of franchises like "Star Wars" and "Star Trek" to my generation is not simply the valiant heroes, the classic villains, or even the special effects, but rather the great philosophical questions that undergird the plot lines. Of course, such questions were not unique to 'modern' science fiction. In fact, the 19th century was filled with classics such as Mary Shelly's "Frankenstein" and H. G. Wells' "The Invisible Man" that were able to synthesize the same formulations.

In fact, I was reminded of the Wells' classic recently when praying with the Gospel of St. Luke. It was always curious to me how Jesus could be so understanding with prostitutes, tax collectors and adulterers and so harsh with the Pharisees and Sadducees. After all, the Pharisees and Sadducees were the leading men of Jesus' day. In an era were literacy was rare, Pharisees and Sadducees were educated men, schooled in the intricacies of the Jewish faith. Even more to the point, they were men of the temple that, by and large, remained faithful to every prescript of the Jewish law.

At least that was their reputation. In fact, Jesus is going to challenge this reputation rather vehemently in St. Luke's gospel. "Now you Pharisees cleanse the outside of the cup and of the plate, but inside you yourselves are full of greed and robbery." Clearly in this verse Jesus is accusing the Pharisees of hypocrisy. But the subtly of this hypocrisy is enlightening.

Usually when one thinks of hypocrisy, we think of someone who doesn't practice what he preaches. Technically speaking, this is not true. Although someone who doesn't practice what he preaches is always a sinner, they may or may not be a hypocrite. For hypocrisy is not simply failing to practice what you preach. Hypocrisy is failing to believe what you preach.

This subtle, but crucial, distinction is the reason why Jesus is so harsh with the Pharisees while at the same time He is so gentle with other sinners. You see, while other sinners recognize their weakness and admit it, hypocrites deny their weakness and strive to cover it up. This is why hypocrisy is one of the most destructive weapons in the devil's arsenal of shame. When faced with the evilness of his behavior, the sinner throws himself on the mercy of Jesus. The hypocrite, on the other hand, seeks to hide it; hide it from others, hide it from Jesus and even hide it from himself. In doing so, the sinner really seeks to make himself, or at least his sinfulness, invisible.

This he does in numerous ways. First, as Jesus points out in St. Luke's gospel, the hypocrite makes sure certain parts of his life are really shiny and clean so as to keep others focusing on them instead of looking in other, perhaps darker places. This is part of the reason why the Pharisees are so diligent about maintaining the visible aspects of the Jewish law. They hope by emphasizing these aspects, people, including themselves, will forget about the others.

Second, the hypocrite tries to hide and cover up his behavior, not just from others, but, most destructively, from himself as well. This he does by mutilating his conscience into believing that what he has done is not really THAT evil. After that lie has taken root, the hypocrite then convinces himself that perhaps his behavior is not evil at all. In fact, in some extreme cases (examples of these kinds of cases can be seen in the disaster marriage has become in our western society), that bad behavior may even become laudable behavior. Should anyone challenge his delusion or threaten to make visible what the hypocrite has worked so hard to hide, the hypocrite becomes irate, even to the point of violence. This is why, in the case of the Pharisees, they end up crucifying Jesus. The hypocritical heart cannot tolerate the reality of exposure. (Continued on last page.)



(Continued from Page 1) Isn't this really true in our age as well? Isn't this why people promoting abortion "rights", same gender "marriage" or "physician assisted" suicide become so angry when their opinions are challenged? In fact, the arbitrariness of this hypocrisy always strikes me in the reality that smoking tobacco is one of society's last great taboos, but the legalization of marijuana is one of its new crusades.

Perhaps, then, this gives us a gauge to measure the hypocrisy in our own lives. To the extent we live dual lives, to the extent we are the invisible man, we are victims of hypocrisy. The old adage is really true. Our true character is revealed, not when all eyes are on us, but when no one else is around. If the ability to make ourselves invisible would change our behavior in any significant way, perhaps that is because we are more interested in what people around us think rather than what God thinks, which may be a pretty darn good definition of hypocrisy.

Of course, it is also a pretty good one for stupidity as well. After all, we are never invisible to God. Every action, no matter how clandestine or well hidden we may think it is or how well we may have covered it up, is done in the presence of Jesus Christ. To pretend like it isn't is not only the very definition of hypocrisy, but is pretty foolish as well.

Notice carefully, the recognition of Jesus' omnipresence in our lives only bothers us to the extent hypocrisy has infected our lives. This recognition should not and does scare the sinner, regardless of how awful their sinful behavior may truly be. After all, the sinner recognizes his evil as well as his dependence on the Lord for mercy. And, as the Lord has shown over and over again in the scriptures, He is more than willing to show it when we ask!

Of course, it is not too late to transform our hypocrisy into sinfulness. However, it will be painful because there is only one way to do so...expose our darkness to the light of Jesus Christ. This is done most painlessly and most fruitfully in the sacrament of confession. For it is here, in the great light of the sacrament of the Lord's mercy, that we discover the greatest truth of all...God doesn't seek to condemn us, but to forgive us. All He requests is that we admit the need.
