Friends,

It's been depicted a number of ways. Whether it's the light bulb that suddenly appears over the cartoon character's head or the all too frequent "Doah" made famous by Homer Simpson, all of us have experienced that flash of insight that instantaneously makes obvious to us something that before was impossible for us to see. And of all the "light bulb" moments that have occurred throughout mankind's history, none was more important than the feast we celebrate today. For today, the feast of the Epiphany, we celebrate the insight that the Savior of the Jews, the infant born to Mary and Joseph, is the savior of the Gentiles as well.

And this happens in a most beautiful way. Three Magi from the east, three kings, bring gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh to the newborn king of the Jews. And what's the big deal about that? Well, for starters, the journey of the Magi does at least three things. First of all, it fulfills the Old Testament prophecy from Isaiah. "Caravans of camels shall fill you," the prophet Isaiah says of the Messiah. "Dromedaries from the East shall come bearing gold and frankincense and proclaiming the praises of one who is to liberate the nation of Israel." And with the arrival of the Magi in Bethlehem this prophecy of Isaiah is fulfilled.

And the fulfillment of this Messianic prophesy leads directly to the second lesson the story of the Magi teaches. For having witnessed the fulfillment of this prophesy, the Jews would have begun to recognize Jesus as the Messiah. And this is precisely why St. Matthew records this episode in his gospel. He is hoping to convince his Jewish audience of the truth we know so well today. The truth that the baby lying in the manger is the Messiah, God's anointed one, who is to make Israel a great nation by restoring the throne of Israel's greatest king – King David.

And if that were all this child were to accomplish, he would be forever remembered as one of history's most significant figures. But it is not. In fact, it is the third lesson of the Magi's visit to Jesus that is by far the most significant. The Magi, after all, are not Jews but Gentiles. They could care less about the throne of King David or Jewish prophecies about some messiah – neither of which they had ever heard about. And yet, the Magi are drawn to this greatest moment in Jewish history because there is something happening here that transcends Judaism. For, the presence of these Gentile wise men indicates that the Jewish Messiah is something more than merely the savior of the Jews. In fact, the child of Mary, the Jewish Messiah, is the savior of the Gentiles as well.

But, even more is going on than just this. For what did the Magi do immediately prior to offering their gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh? St. Matthew recounts that these Gentile wise men, "prostrated themselves and did [Jesus] homage." You see, these foreigners, these Gentiles, recognize something in the baby lying in the manger that is still mysterious even to the Jews. The Magi recognize that the infant lying in the manger is also God. Thus, they could prostrate themselves and pay homage without being guilty of blasphemy. And in doing so, they provide yet more proof of the divinity of the infant Jesus.

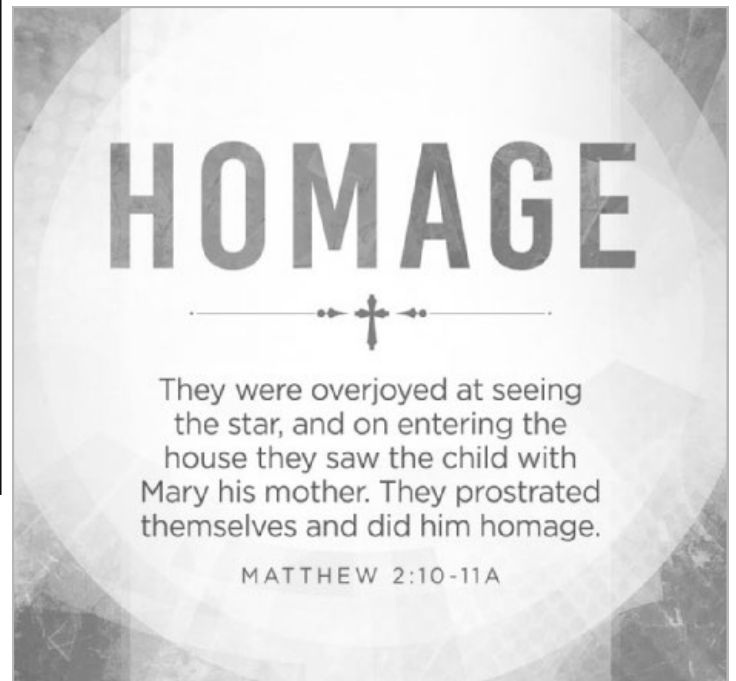

(Continued from page one.) And it seems to me that this story of the Magi has tremendous significance for today's multicultural and pluralistic society. For it demonstrates that the birth of Jesus Christ is not some isolated event intended exclusively for the benefit of those living in that particular region or in that particular culture or born into a particular religion. No. The birth of Jesus Christ is an event of cataclysmic significance precisely because it is the birth of, not just a man, but of God as man. And because the birth of Jesus marks the entrance of the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity into humanity, it cannot be held bound by location, or region, or custom. Rather, since Jesus is God, His birth is significant for the entire realm of creation.

And so it is no mere accident that the Church founded by Jesus Christ is called catholic. For the word catholic means universal. And it only makes sense that the Church founded by Jesus Christ would be a universal or a catholic Church, open to all peoples, whether Jew or Gentile, rich or poor, black, white, Asian, Hispanic, Indian or anything else. And this is why when we say in the creed we are about to profess that we believe in One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church, the word catholic really says more about the divinity of Jesus Christ than it says about a particular denomination. The Church founded by Jesus Christ is called "catholic" precisely because the man Jesus, the Christ, is also God.

And this is why it is so important that we pray that all nations follow the example of the three Magi in today's gospel in seeking both to know and to worship Jesus Christ. For now we should better understand why it does make a difference what religion one practices. For if Jesus really is God, then the Church He founded is the one that He hopes all will embrace. And so, this week, make a special prayer that all peoples will be able to take advantage of the truths we, as Catholics, are so privileged to partake in so easily. Not the least of which is the truth that we continue to celebrate during this Christmas season. The truth that Jesus Christ is both God and man.
